## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

ASSERTING THAT RACISM IS A PUBLIC HEALTH CRISIS AND URGING THE STATE TO COMMIT TO RECOGNIZING AND ADDRESSING THE RESULTING INEQUITIES.

WHEREAS, public health is defined by the World Health 1 Organization as "the art and science of preventing disease, 2 prolonging life, and promoting health through the organized 3 4 efforts of society"; and 5 WHEREAS, racism is a social system with many dimensions 6 7 that act on systemic, institutional, and interpersonal levels; 8 and 9 10 WHEREAS, structural racism has resulted in race functioning as a social determinant of health, with persistent racial 11 12 disparities in areas such as health care, criminal justice, housing, education, employment, worker protections, climate, 13 14 food access, and technology; and 15 WHEREAS, systemic racism resulting from the inherent biases 16 17 and prejudices within social and political organizations, groups, and institutions continues to create barriers to success 18 for people of color; and 19 20 WHEREAS, racism intersects with other forms of prejudice 21 and oppression that increase adverse outcomes, including 22 discrimination based on immigration status, gender and sexual 23 identity, and mental and physical abilities; and 24 25 WHEREAS, the coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic 26 27 has revealed, reaffirmed, and cast in sharp relief the exigent 28 nature of these pre-existing inequities caused by systemic 29 racism; and 30 31 WHEREAS, the John A. Burns School of Medicine (JABSOM) reported in May of 2020 that the highest rates of positive 32

4	WHEREAS, according to Keawe'aimoku Kaholokula, professor and

6	the higher risk of infection among NHPI communities is linked to	
7	pre-existing and underlying inequities in the social	
8	determinants of public health across racial and ethnic groups	
9	that are ubiquitous in the United States; now, therefore,
