

HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES AND COUNTY LAW ENFORCEMENT TO INCREASE THE ENFORCEMENT OF LAWS WITHIN BEACH TRANSIT CORRIDORS.

WHEREAS, state law and county ordinances require the 1 construction and maintenance of beach transit corridors so that 2 3 members of the public may access public beaches and the ocean; 4 and 5 6 WHEREAS, many beach transit corridors are located in residential areas, between two private properties; and 7 8 WHEREAS, beach transit corridors have become a haven for 9 criminal activity, including drug transactions, homeless 10 sleeping, and illegal dumping; and 11 12 13 WHEREAS, members of the public using beach transit corridors also play loud music in violation of noise ordinances 14 and also make other loud noises that disrupt residents' quiet 15 16 enjoyment of their property; and 17 WHEREAS, residents who have attempted to remind beach 18 transit corridors users of the law have been met with threats of 19 physical violence; and 20 21 22 WHEREAS, residents who contact law enforcement agencies regarding the criminal activities at beach transit corridors are 23 24 met with officers who neglect to enforce the laws or refuse to take any action; and 25 26 27 WHEREAS, pursuant to section 199-4(a), Hawaii Revised 28 Statutes, the Department of Land and Natural Resources, through 29 the Board of Land and Natural Resources, is one of the few

1 departments of the State with the authority to appoint its employees with police powers; and 2 3 WHEREAS, pursuant to section 199-4(a), Hawaii Revised 4 Statutes, persons appointed with police powers by the Board of 5 6 Land and Natural Resources have the power to enforce all state 7 laws and rules and county ordinances within lands and waters of 8 the State; and 9 WHEREAS, while the owners of lands adjacent to beach 10 transit corridors have complied with their duties to maintain 11 the corridors pursuant to section 115-10, Hawaii Revised 12 13 Statutes, the Department of Land and Natural Resources and county law enforcement have failed to fulfill their duties to 14 keep the corridors safe and to protect the residents of those 15 16 neighborhoods from threats; now, therefore, 17 18 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 19 Thirty-first Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 20 of 2021, the Senate concurring, that the Department of Land and Natural Resources and local county enforcement are urged to 21 22 enforce the state laws and administrative rules and county 23 ordinances within beach transit corridors: and 24 25 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Land and Natural Resources and county law enforcement are urged to 26 increase their presence at beach transit corridors, including 27 having a law enforcement officer physically visit the beach 28 29 transit corridor multiple times per day; and 30 31 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Land and Natural Resources and county law enforcement are urged to 32 install cameras, motion sensor lights, audio recording devices, 33 34 and other fixtures at beach access corridors to assist in gathering evidence for the prosecution of criminal and other 35 illegal activities conducted there and to deter other improper 36 37 behavior; and 38 39 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Land and Natural Resources is urged to relocate, as allowed by law, any 40 beach access corridors that the Department and county law 41 42 enforcement cannot effectively monitor; and
