HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE AND CONSUMER AFFAIRS TO REVISIT TITLE 16, CHAPTER 89, OF THE HAWAII ADMINISTRATIVE RULES TO PROHIBIT REGISTERED NURSES FROM DELEGATING THE INTERPRETATION OF DIAGNOSTIC LABORATORY RESULTS TO UNLICENSED ASSISTIVE PERSONNEL.

WHEREAS, section 457-7.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, 1 2 authorizes a registered nurse to delegate nursing care tasks, functions, and activities to unlicensed assistive personnel in a 3 manner that is appropriate to the level of knowledge and skill 4 5 of the unlicensed assistive personnel, as long as this 6 delegation complies with applicable federal and state laws and does not include the practice-pervasive functions of assessment, 7 8 evaluation, and nursing judgment; and 9

10 WHEREAS, title 16, chapter 89, subchapter 15, Hawaii 11 Administrative Rules, contemplates rules relating to the 12 delegation of nursing care tasks to unlicensed assistive 13 personnel, while section 16-89-2, Hawaii Administrative Rules, 14 defines an "unlicensed assistive person" to mean an individual 15 who is not licensed to practice nursing, but who provides tasks 16 of nursing care delegated by a registered nurse; and

18 WHEREAS, section 16-89-100, Hawaii Administrative Rules, 19 states that the intent of the Board of Nursing is for the 20 delegation of tasks of nursing care to unlicensed assistive 21 personnel to be the exception rather than the rule, unless a 22 registered nurse can justify the need for delegation; and 23

WHEREAS, a July 22, 2019, article in *Medical News Today*noted that diagnostic errors happen across all areas of medicine
and that researchers' findings showed the cause of most
misdiagnoses to be clinical judgment failures; and



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WHEREAS, according to a February 22, 2020, article in 1 2 Healthline, in the United States, twelve million people are affected by medical diagnostic errors each year, and an 3 estimated forty thousand to eighty thousand people die annually 4 5 from complications from these misdiagnoses; and 6 7 WHEREAS, the article further states that women and 8 minorities are twenty to thirty percent more likely to be 9 misdiagnosed; and 10 11 WHEREAS, on September 15, 2020, the U.S. News & World 12 Report reported that misdiagnosis due to miscommunication is not uncommon, and that as many as sixty-two percent of laboratory 13 14 and thirty-six percent of imaging results are overlooked by health care providers; and 15 16 17 WHEREAS, while these statistics are not focused on the area 18 of delegation by registered nurses to unlicensed assistive personnel, they highlight the complexities associated with 19 interpreting tests and diagnosing conditions, which 20 fundamentally rely upon the assessment, evaluation, and judgment 21 of trained medical professionals; and 22 23 24 WHEREAS, misinterpreting diagnostic laboratory results can 25 have adverse effects on patient safety and outcomes, increase patient anxiety, and reduce self-management efficacy; and 26 27 28 WHEREAS, because of these issues, it is important that the 29 person communicating test results and their meaning to patients 30 be licensed; and 31 32 WHEREAS, the National Council of State Boards of Nursing, 33 in its "National Guidelines for Nursing Delegation", confirms that the licensed nurse cannot delegate nursing judgment or any 34 35 activity that will involve nursing judgment or critical decision making, and further, that "Licensed nurses must be aware that 36 delegation is at the nurse's discretion, with consideration of 37 38 the particular situation."; and 39 40 WHEREAS, adopting rules that remove a registered nurse's 41 discretion to delegate the function of interpreting diagnostic



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1 laboratory results to unlicensed assistive personnel will 2 promote patient safety and accountability; now, therefore, 3 4 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 5 Thirty-first Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session of 2021, the Senate concurring, that the Department of Commerce 6 7 and Consumer Affairs is urged to revisit title 16, chapter 89, of the Hawaii Administrative Rules to prohibit registered nurses 8 from delegating the interpretation of diagnostic laboratory 9 results to unlicensed assistive personnel; and 10 11 12 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor and 13 Director of Commerce and Consumer Affairs. 14

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
