HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE BOARD OF EDUCATION TO CONSIDER HAWAII RESIDENTS AS PART OF THE QUALIFIED CANDIDATE POOL TO SERVE AS SUPERINTENDENT OF EDUCATION OF HAWAII'S PUBLIC SCHOOL SYSTEM.

WHEREAS, on March 9, 2021, Superintendent Christina 1 Kishimoto announced that she will not be seeking a renewal of 2 her contract as Superintendent of Education of Hawaii's public 3 school system; and 4 5 WHEREAS, Superintendent Christina Kishimoto's term as 6 7 Superintendent of Education ends on July 30, 2021; and 8 9 WHEREAS, as the chief executive officer of Hawaii's public school system, the Superintendent of Education's 10 responsibilities are vast, including serving as an instructional 11 leader and administering programs of education and public 12 instruction throughout the State; and 13 14 WHEREAS, the search for a new Superintendent of Education 15 is a rigorous and extensive process to enable the Board of 16 Education to appoint a leader to head the Department of 17 Education, the only statewide public school district in the 18 19 nation, that comprises fifteen complex areas and two hundred fifty-seven public schools and about one hundred eighty thousand 20 students; and 21 22 WHEREAS, the responsibilities of the Superintendent of 23 Education include: administering education at the primary and 24 secondary school levels; adult education; school library 25 services; health education and instruction, excluding dental 26 health treatment; special education and Title I funded programs 27 at the prekindergarten level; and other programs as established 28 by law; and 29

WHEREAS, the appointment of a Superintendent of Education 1 to head the Department of Education is time-critical, especially 2 given the educational, health, fiscal, and other impacts of the 3 coronavirus on the education of students; and 4 5 WHEREAS, the responsibilities of the Superintendent of 6 Education is evermore important as the State seeks to safely 7 reopen schools and lead Hawaii's public school system out of 8 this pandemic and into the future; and 9 10 WHEREAS, the Board of Education's vision and direction for 11 the Department of Education are factors in determining the 12 necessary qualifications, experience, knowledge, focus, and 13 attributes of qualified applicants to be considered for a new 14 15 Superintendent of Education to lead Hawaii's public school 16 system; and 17 WHEREAS, Hawaii residents, including individuals from 18 Hawaii's public school system, are integral to creating a pool 19 of qualified applicants and candidates who possess the requisite 20 organizational and leadership skills and vision to lead the 21 Department of Education and promote and sustain instructional 22 programs conducive to student learning and achievement and staff 23 professional growth; now, therefore, 24 25 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 26 Thirty-first Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 27 of 2021, the Senate concurring, that the Board of Education is 28 29 urged to consider Hawaii residents as part of the qualified candidate pool to serve as Superintendent of Education of 30 31 Hawaii's public school system; and 32

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Board of Education is
requested to consider applicants from Hawaii's public school
system as part of the qualified candidate pool; and
