

HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING STATE LAW ENFORCEMENT ENTITIES, INCLUDING THE DEPARTMENT OF THE ATTORNEY GENERAL, SHERIFF DIVISION OF THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY, AND HARBORS DIVISION OF THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION, TO COLLABORATE WITH THE DIVISION OF CONSERVATION AND RESOURCES ENFORCEMENT OF THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES TO SUPPORT ITS MISSION IN THIS TIME OF NEED.

WHEREAS, the Division of Conservation and Resources 1 Enforcement of the Department of Land and Natural Resources is 2 responsible for enforcement activities of the Department, 3 including enforcement of all state laws and rules involving 4 5 state lands, state parks, historic sites, forest reserves, 6 aquatic life, wildlife areas, coastal zones, conservation 7 districts, and state shores, as well as county ordinances involving county parks; and 8 9

10 WHEREAS, the mission of the Division of Conservation and 11 Resources Enforcement is to uphold the laws that serve to 12 protect, conserve, and manage Hawaii's unique and limited 13 natural, cultural, and historic resources held in public trust 14 for current and future generations of residents of, and visitors 15 to, Hawaii nei; and

17 WHEREAS, although the Division of Conservation and 18 Resources Enforcement's jurisdiction covers state-owned lands 19 from the mountains to three miles offshore, the Division only 20 employs about one hundred officers statewide; and

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WHEREAS, the State's natural resources are sacred and must
be protected in a manner that will allow them to be preserved
for the benefit and enjoyment of generations to come; and

WHEREAS, as a focal industry for the State, tourism is 1 largely dependent on the availability and sustainability of the 2 State's natural resources; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, many of the lands managed by the Department of Land and Natural Resources are closed to the public as a result 6 of illegal dumping, pallet burning, illegal camping, vandalism, 7 8 and other acts that violate state laws and rules; and 9 WHEREAS, since the beginning of the COVID-19 pandemic, news 10 releases have been issued regarding various abuses of the 11 State's natural resources, including illegal gatherings at Ka'ena 12 13 Point State Park on Oahu, with reports of illegal drinking, littering, beach bonfires, burning of rubber tires, and illegal 14 campers at the Makua-Keawa'ula and Mokule'ia sections of the 15 park; the lighting of Christmas tree bonfires at Ahu O Laka; an 16 17 unauthorized excavation at Polihale on Kauai, where extensive 18 subsurface cultural resources, including burials, are located; and vandals cutting through fencing erected at Makena State Park 19 20 on Maui to keep people away from Pu'u Ola'i because of large 21 beach parties that were being held during the pandemic; and 22 WHEREAS, at Pokai Bay, boats illegally harbored close to 23 24 shore have dumped their sewage into the water and previously 25 ignored requests to vacate, while offshore of Kawaihae in Hawaii 26 County, aquarium fish were illegally harvested; and 27 28 WHEREAS, these areas all fall under the jurisdiction of the Division of Conservation and Resources Enforcement, but because 29 30 the Division is understaffed, there is a lack of enforcement 31 presence; and 32 33 WHEREAS, the Department of Land and Natural Resources has 34 closed certain access points to Keawa'ula and Ka'ena Point State 35 Park; now, therefore, 36 37 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Thirty-first Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 38 39 of 2021, the Senate concurring, that this body urges other state law enforcement entities, including the Department of the 40 Attorney General, Sheriff Division of the Department of Public 41 42 Safety, and Harbors Division of the Department of

Transportation, to collaborate with the Division of Conservation 1 and Resources Enforcement of the Department of Land and Natural 2 Resources to support its mission in this time of need; and 3 4 5 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, 6 7 Chairperson of the Board of Land and Natural Resources, Attorney General, Director of Public Safety, and Director of 8 9 Transportation. 10 11 12
