HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES, IN COORDINATION WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH, TO COLLECT DATA ON LESBIAN, GAY, BISEXUAL, TRANSGENDER, QUEER OR QUESTIONING, PANSEXUAL, ASEXUAL, GENDER NON-CONFORMING, AND INTERSEX YOUTH WHO ARE UNDER THE SUPERVISION OF THE COURTS AND THE HAWAII YOUTH CORRECTIONAL FACILITY.

WHEREAS, lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer or 1 questioning, pansexual, asexual, and gender non-conforming 2 (LGBTQ+) youth are historically overrepresented in juvenile 3 detention and correctional facilities in the juvenile system; 4 5 and 6 WHEREAS, intersex variation is rarely reported leading to 7 missed information about LGBTQ+ and intersex youth; and 8 9 10 WHEREAS, LGBTQ+ youth, particularly LGBTQ+ youth of color, face discrimination and stigma that leads to criminalization and 11 increased interactions with law enforcement and the criminal 12 justice system; and 13 14 WHEREAS, for some LGBTQ+ youth, especially LGBTQ+ youth of 15 color and transgender and non-conforming youth, these factors 16 play a large role in increasing their interactions with law 17 enforcement and ultimately their overrepresentation in the 18 juvenile and criminal justice systems; and 19 20 WHEREAS, LGBTQ+ youth in Hawaii experience stark physical 21 and mental health disparities, as reported in the Hawaii 22 Department of Health's 2017 and 2018 Sexual and Gender 23 Minorities Health Data reports; and 24

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WHEREAS, the primary objective of the Kawailoa Youth and 1 Family Wellness Center, housed within the Hawaii Youth 2 Correctional Facility, is to prevent delinquency; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, the Kawailoa Youth and Family Wellness Center provides services and programs to meet the needs of youth or 6 young adults within the criminal justice system in addition to 7 8 at risk youth outside the criminal justice system; and 9 WHEREAS, specific data collected on sexual orientation, 10 gender identity, gender expression, and intersex variation 11 intersects with the statewide anti-discrimination work and could 12 inform decision-making processes such as identifying the 13 possible disproportionate impact of the criminal justice system 14 and evaluating the efficacy of work done to alleviate obstacles 15 unique to LGBTQ+ and intersex youth populations; now, therefore, 16 17 18 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Thirty-first Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 19 of 2021, the Senate concurring, that the Department of Human 20 Services, in coordination with the Department of Health, is 21 requested to collect data on lesbian, gay, bisexual, 22 transgender, queer or questioning, pansexual, asexual, gender 23 non-conforming, and intersex youth who are under the supervision 24 of the courts and the Hawaii Youth Correctional Facility; and 25 26 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Public Safety 27 shall work with the Sexual and Gender Minority Workgroup within 28 29 the Department of Health to ensure that the data collection is administered in accordance with LGBTQ+ and intersex data 30 collection best practices; and 31 32 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 33 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, Director 34 of Public Safety, Director of Health, and Director of Human 35 Services. 36 37 38 OFFERED BY: 39

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
