## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE TO ENSURE THE INCLUSION OF SOCIALLY DISADVANTAGED FARMERS AND RANCHERS IN THE DEVELOPMENT, ADOPTION, IMPLEMENTATION, AND ENFORCEMENT OF FOOD AND AGRICULTURE LAWS, RULES, POLICIES, AND PROGRAMS.

WHEREAS, the Legislature recognizes the importance of 1 investing in the long-term prosperity of the State's food and 2 farming system, starting with its farmers; and 3 4 WHEREAS, the Legislature finds that historical and ongoing 5 dispossession and deterritorialization has greatly impacted 6 Native Hawaiian access to land and other resources such that 7 structural barriers to farming continue to exist for Native 8 9 Hawaiians; and 10 WHEREAS, the Legislature further finds that immigrant 11 farmers and farmers of color have historically not had equitable 12 access to land and other resources necessary to conduct farming 13 in Hawaii, and that legacy of disadvantage persists; and 14 15 WHEREAS, according to the United States Department of 16 Agriculture National Agricultural Statistics Service, 2017 17 Census of Agriculture, female farmers represent thirty-four 18 percent of all farmers referenced as primary producers in the 19 20 State, while only twenty-five percent of Hawaii farmers referenced as principal producers are women of color; and 21 22 WHEREAS, the Legislature also finds that existing federal 23 agricultural policies have failed to provide sufficient and 24 appropriate technical assistance and financial support, 25 including farmer cooperative creation, for socially 26 disadvantaged farmers and ranchers; now, therefore, 27
