## HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES TO SUBMIT A PETITION TO LIST THE OAHU PUEO AS A THREATENED OR ENDANGERED SPECIES UNDER THE ENDANGERED SPECIES ACT.

1 2 3 4	WHEREAS, the Hawaiian short-eared owl, Asio flammeus sandwichensis, commonly known as the pueo, is an endemic subspecies of the short-eared owl; and
5	WHEREAS, the pueo is believed to have become established in
6	the Hawaiian Islands after the arrival of the first Polynesians
7	and is now endemic to all major islands of Hawaii except Ni'ihau;
8	and
9	
10	WHEREAS, the pueo was revered by Hawaiians, and was an
11	aumakua or ancestral guardian of many Hawaiian families, and an
12 13	encounter with the pueo was considered to be an omen; and
13	WHEREAS, in Hawaiian mythology, the pueo is the "bird of
15	wisdom, " known for offering guidance and protection; and
16	
17	WHEREAS, in the late 1800s, pueo once flew in great numbers
18	on Oʻahu, but today, according to The Pueo Project, a study by
19	the College of Tropical Agriculture and Human Resources of the
20	University of Hawaii at Manoa and the Department of Natural
21	Resources and Environmental Management of the Department of Land
22	and Natural Resources, the number of pueo on Oahu has declined
23 24	to an estimated eight hundred seven individual birds; and
24 25	WHEREAS, pueo nest on the ground, in grassy areas, laying
26	three to six eggs over a few months; and

WHEREAS, pueo eggs and young pueo are vulnerable to feral 1 2 cats, dogs, rats, and mongooses; and 3 WHEREAS, in addition to being vulnerable to many predators, 4 5 loss of habitat has contributed to the reduction in the pueo 6 population; and 7 WHEREAS, Chapter 13-124, Exhibit 2, Hawaii Administrative 8 9 Rules, lists the pueo on Oahu as endangered; and 10 11 WHEREAS, protections for the pueo under state law and administrative rule are limited to prohibiting persons from 12 13 exporting, possessing, processing, selling, offering for sale, 14 delivering, carrying, transporting, or shipping, harassing, harming, pursuing, hunting, shooting, wounding, killing, 15 trapping, capturing, or collecting pueo and removing, damaging, 16 17 or disturbing the nests of pueo; and 18 19 WHEREAS, without federal protection, the Oahu pueo will be at risk of extinction; and 20 21 WHEREAS, protections provided under the Endangered Species 22 23 Act can help the pueo population increase to a healthy and sustainable level; now, therefore, 24 25 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 26 27 Thirty-first Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session of 2021, the Senate concurring, that the Department of Land and 28 29 Natural Resources is requested to petition the United States 30 Secretary of the Interior, through the United States Fish and Wildlife Service, to protect the Oahu pueo, also known as the 31 32 Hawaiian short-eared owl (Asio flammeus sandwichensis) as a 33 threatened or endangered species; and 34 35 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 36 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to Chairperson of the Board of Land and Natural Resources and the Program Manager of the 37 38 Endangered Species Recovery Committee. 39 40 un 41 OFFERED BY: MAR 0 5 2021 HCR LRB 21-0087-2.doc 2
