HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF LAND AND NATURAL RESOURCES TO SUBMIT A PETITION TO LIST THE PUEO AS A THREATENED OR ENDANGERED SPECIES UNDER THE ENDANGERED SPECIES ACT.

1 2	WHEREAS, the Hawaiian short-eared owl, Asio flammeus sandwichensis, commonly known as the pueo, is an endemic
3 4	subspecies of the short-eared owl; and
5	WHEREAS, the pueo is believed to have become established in
6	the Hawaiian Islands after the arrival of the first Polynesians
7	and is now endemic to all major islands of Hawaii except Ni'ihau;
8	and
9	
10 11	WHEREAS, the pueo was revered by Hawaiians and was an
12	aumakua or ancestral guardian of many Hawaiian families, and an encounter with the pueo was considered to be an omen; and
13	encouncer with the pued was considered to be an omen, and
14	WHEREAS, in Hawaiian mythology, the pueo is the "bird of
15	wisdom," known for offering guidance and protection; and
16	
17	WHEREAS, in the late 1800s, pueo once flew in great numbers
18	on Oahu, but today, according to The Pueo Project, a study by
19	the Department of Natural Resources and Environmental Management
20	of the College of Tropical Agriculture and Human Resources of
21	the University of Hawaii at Manoa and Department of Land and
22 23	Natural Resources, the number of pueo on Oahu has declined to an estimated eight hundred seven individual birds; and
23 24	estimated eight hundred seven individual bilds, and
25	WHEREAS, pueo nest on the ground, in grassy areas, laying
26	three to six eggs over a few months; and
27	
28	WHEREAS, pueo eggs and young pueo are vulnerable to feral
29	cats, dogs, rats, and mongooses; and

1 WHEREAS, in addition to being vulnerable to many predators, 2 loss of habitat has contributed to the reduction in the pueo 3 population; and 4 5 WHEREAS, Chapter 13-124, Exhibit 2, Hawaii Administrative Rules, lists the pueo on Oahu as endangered; and 6 7 8 WHEREAS, protections for the pueo under state law and administrative rule are limited to prohibiting persons from 9 10 exporting, possessing, processing, selling, offering for sale, 11 delivering, carrying, transporting, shipping, harassing, harming, pursuing, hunting, shooting, wounding, killing, 12 trapping, capturing, or collecting pueo and removing, damaging, 13 or disturbing the nests of pueo; and 14 15 16 WHEREAS, without federal protection, the pueo will be at 17 risk of extinction; and 18 19 WHEREAS, protections provided under the Endangered Species Act can help the pueo population increase to a healthy and 20 sustainable level; now, therefore, 21 22 23 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Thirty-first Legislature of the State of Hawai'i, Regular Session 24 25 of 2021, the Senate concurring, that the Department of Land and 26 Natural Resources is requested to petition the United States 27 Secretary of the Interior, through the United States Fish and Wildlife Service, to protect the pueo, also known as the 28 29 Hawaiian short-eared owl (Asio flammeus sandwichensis), by 30 listing it as a threatened or endangered species under the 31 Endangered Species Act; and 32 33 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 34 Concurrent Resolution be transmitted to the Chairperson of the 35 Board of Land and Natural Resources and Program Manager of the Endangered Species Recovery Committee. 36
