HOUSE RESOLUTION

DESIGNATING THE FIRST WEEK OF MAY AS TARDIVE DYSKINESIA AWARENESS WEEK.

1 WHEREAS, Tardive Dyskinesia is a serious side effect of antipsychotic medications commonly used to treat schizophrenia 2 3 and other mental health conditions; and 4 5 WHEREAS, Tardive Dyskinesia causes involuntary repetitive 6 movements of the face and limbs that can vary in frequency and 7 amplitude; and 8 9 WHEREAS, according to the National Alliance on Mental 10 Illness, one in every four patients receiving long-term treatment with an antipsychotic medication will experience 11 Tardive Dyskinesia; and 12 13 14 WHEREAS, Tardive Dyskinesia symptoms do not always show up 15 immediately and may have long-lasting effects even after 16 discontinuing medication; and 17 18 WHEREAS, elderly, female, and diabetic individuals are most at risk for developing Tardive Dyskinesia; and 19 20 WHEREAS, antipsychotic medication and its effects should be 21 closely monitored by health-care professionals and at-risk 22 individuals should seek regular evaluations to recognize early 23 24 signs of Tardive Dyskinesia; and 25 WHEREAS, public education is necessary for identifying 26 signs of Tardive Dyskinesia so that the severity of the side 27 effect may be reduced by reassessing and adjusting medications; 28 29 and 30

1 WHEREAS, over the past three years, 33 states and Washington, D.C. have declared the first week in May as Tardive 2 3 Dyskinesia Awareness Week; now, therefore, 4 5 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 6 Thirty-first Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 7 of 2021, that the first full week of May is designated each year 8 as Tardive Dyskinesia Awareness Week in the State of Hawaii; and 9 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Education, 10 11 the Department of Health, and the United States Department of Health and Human Services are encouraged to increase public 12 awareness about the effects of antipsychotic medication and its 13 link to Tardive Dyskinesia; and 14 15 16 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Resolution be transmitted to the Chairperson of the Board of 17 Education, the Superintendent of Education, the Director of 18 19 Health, the United States Department of Health and Human 20 Services, and the Governor of the State of Hawaii.
