HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH TO EXPLORE WAYS IT CAN EXERCISE OVERSIGHT OVER COMMUNITY HEALTH CENTERS AND OTHER MEDICAL SERVICE ENTITIES WHEN A DANGER TO THE COMMUNITY'S HEALTH EXISTS.

WHEREAS, Article IX, section 9 of the Hawaii State 1 Constitution requires the State to "provide for the protection 2 and promotion of the public health"; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, community health centers, also known as federally qualified health centers, are the cornerstone of Hawaii's health 6 care system and provide essential services to the State's most 7 vulnerable populations; and 8 9 10 WHEREAS, because community health centers often serve federally recognized areas where residents face barriers to 11 getting health care, the State must ensure that these centers 12 13 provide proficient medical services to its residents; and 14 15 WHEREAS, recent events have demonstrated the importance of ensuring that community health centers and other medical service 16 entities are properly staffed and skillfully managed; and 17 18 WHEREAS, the current coronavirus disease 2019 pandemic has 19 20 shown how vulnerable our communities are to a worldwide public 21 health catastrophe; and 22 WHEREAS, community health centers provide critical health 23 care services and must have the necessary resources to handle 24 such public health emergencies; and 25 26 WHEREAS, in 2019, the only community health center on the 27 28 island of Molokai closed for four days in August due to staff 29 shortages; specifically, the center did not have a physician on staff, in violation of federal requirements; and 30 31

1 WHEREAS, the closure of the clinic put at risk the health 2 and safety of Molokai residents who were unable to see a doctor or obtain crucial medication; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, although state officials attempted to investigate the center following the closure, the health center refused to 6 cooperate with the investigation; and 7 8 9 WHEREAS, other types of medical service entities have also 10 experienced disturbing incidents, including a high-profile event 11 involving the death of a child at a Kailua dental practice; and 12 13 WHEREAS, given these past events and the Hawaii State Constitution's mandate that the State provide for the protection 14 and promotion of the public health, it is incumbent upon the 15 16 State to study ways to ensure that community health centers and other medical service entities are providing proficient services 17 18 to the communities they serve; now, therefore, 19 20 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Thirty-first Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 21 of 2021, that the Department of Health is requested to conduct a 22 23 study that explores options for it to provide better oversight 24 over community health centers, dental clinics, and other medical 25 service entities; and 26 27 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the study is requested to include: 28 29 30 (1)A recommendation regarding additional authority that will enable the Department of Health to adequately 31 32 oversee community health centers, dental clinics, and other medical service entities; 33 34 An overview of other jurisdictions that oversee these 35 (2) types of medical service entities, and how those 36 jurisdictions provide oversight; 37 38 A recommendation regarding whether the Governor, 39 (3) Department of Health, or another entity should have 40 41 the authority to order the closure of a medical service entity, or take control of a medical service 42



1 entity, if there is a threat to the health and safety 2 of the community or if a determination is made that 3 the medical service entity is not providing proper medical services; and 4 5 6 (4) Recommendations for additional staffing and support for the Department of Health to adequately oversee 7 8 medical service entities; and 9 10 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Health is 11 requested to submit a report to the Legislature of its findings and recommendations, including any proposed legislation, no 12 later than twenty days prior to the convening of the Regular 13 Session of 2022; and 14 15 16 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Resolution be transmitted to the Governor and Director of 17 Health. 18 19 20 21 A-OFFERED BY:
