HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES; DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH, VIA THE BEHAVIORAL RISK FACTOR SURVEILLANCE SYSTEM; AND DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION, VIA THE YOUTH RISK BEHAVIOR SURVEILLANCE SYSTEM, TO COLLECT INFORMATION ON THE SEX, SEXUAL ORIENTATION, AND GENDER IDENTITY AND GENDER EXPRESSION OF RESPONDENTS, INCLUDING RESPONDENTS WHO ARE UNDER THE SUPERVISION OF THE COURTS AND THE HAWAII YOUTH CORRECTIONAL FACILITY.

WHEREAS, major mental and physical health care professional associations recognize that being lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer or questioning, and intersex (LGBTQI) is part of natural variations that occur in sex, sexual orientation, and gender identity; and

WHEREAS, the Department of Health published reports in 2018 and 2019 highlighting the issues facing lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, or queer or questioning (LGBTQ) children and youth in Hawaii, including higher rates of isolation, depression, suicidal ideations or attempts, substance use and misuse, homelessness, and sexual and intimate partner violence; and

14 WHEREAS, to date, data collection efforts indicate a 15 significant population of indigenous lesbian, gay, bisexual, 16 transgender, and queer or questioning youth; and

18 WHEREAS, intersex variation is rarely reported, leading to 19 missed information about LGBTQI; and

21 WHEREAS, LGBTQI youth, particularly LGBTQI youth of color, 22 face discrimination and stigma that leads to criminalization and 23 increased interactions with law enforcement and the criminal 24 justice system; and

26 WHEREAS, for some LGBTQI youth, especially LGBTQI youth of27 color and transgender and non-conforming youth, these factors

play a large role in increasing their interactions with law 1 enforcement and ultimately their overrepresentation in the 2 juvenile and criminal justice systems; and 3 4 5 WHEREAS, the primary objective of the Kawailoa Youth and Family Wellness Center, housed within the Hawaii Youth 6 7 Correctional Facility, is to prevent delinquency; and 8 9 WHEREAS, the Kawailoa Youth and Family Wellness Center 10 provides services and programs to meet the needs of youth or young adults within the criminal justice system, in addition to 11 at risk youth outside the criminal justice system; and 12 13 WHEREAS, specific data collected on sexual orientation, 14 15 gender identity, gender expression, and intersex variation intersects with the statewide anti-discrimination work and could 16 17 inform decision-making processes, such as identifying the possible disproportionate impact of the criminal justice system 18 and evaluating the efficacy of work done to alleviate obstacles 19 unique to LGBTQI and intersex youth populations; and 20 21 22 WHEREAS, the State relies on the Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System as a critical resource for monitoring the 23 24 health of Hawaii's adult population; and 25 26 WHEREAS, the Youth Risk Behavior Surveillance System is a 27 joint effort of the Hawaii Departments of Health and Education for monitoring the health of Hawaii's youth population; now, 28 29 therefore, 30 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 31 Thirty-first Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 32 33 of 2021, that the Department of Human Services; Department of 34 Health, via the Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System; and Department of Education, via the Youth Risk Behavior 35 36 Surveillance System, are requested to collect information on the 37 sex, sexual orientation, and gender identity and gender expression of respondents, including respondents who are under 38 39 the supervision of the courts and the Hawaii Youth Correctional 40 Facility; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Health is 1 2 requested to participate in the Behavioral Risk Factor 3 Surveillance System; and 4 5 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Health is requested to publish a detailed report on the results of the 6 Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System on its website every 7 8 three years; and 9 10 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Health is 11 requested to include questions related to the sex, sexual orientation, and gender identity and gender expression of 12 respondents in its Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System 13 14 questionnaire; and 15 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Health is 16 17 requested to develop its own questions related to respondents' sex, sexual orientation, and gender identity and gender 18 19 expression as part of the Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System questionnaire; and 20 21 22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Health is requested to publish a comprehensive report on the health of 23 Hawaii's LGBTQI community every three years; and 24 25 26 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Health is 27 requested to include in this comprehensive report data collected 28 from the Behavioral Risk Factor Surveillance System; and 29 30 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Health is requested to compare, in each of these reports, the prevalence 31 of health-related risk behaviors, chronic health conditions, and 32 33 use of preventive services between the LGBTQI population, and 34 where possible, LGBTQI sub-populations, and the general population; and 35 36 37 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Health is requested to post each comprehensive report on its website; and 38 39 40 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Public Safety is requested to work with the Sexual and Gender Minority 41 Workgroup within the Department of Health to ensure that the 42

1 data collection is administered in accordance with LGBTQI data 2 collection best practices; and 3 4 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 5 Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, Director of Health, 6 Director of Human Services, Director of Public Safety, 7 Chairperson of the Board of Education, Superintendent of 8 Education, Chairperson of the Board of Regents of the University 9 of Hawaii, and President of the University of Hawaii.
