HOUSE RESOLUTION

URGING FAIR AND HUMANE TREATMENT OF THE UYGHURS, ETHNIC KAZAKHS, KYRGYZ, AND MEMBERS OF OTHER MUSLIM MINORITY GROUPS IN THE XINJIANG UYGHUR AUTONOMOUS REGION IN THE PEOPLE'S REPUBLIC OF CHINA

1 WHEREAS, Article 2 of the 1948 United Nations Convention on the Prevention and the Punishment of the Crime of Genocide, 2 3 which both the United States and the People's Republic of China have ratified, defines genocide as "any of the following acts 4 committed with intent to destroy, in whole or in part, a 5 national, ethnical, racial, or religious groups, as such: (a) 6 7 killing members of the group (b) causing serious bodily or 8 mental harm to members of the group (c) deliberately inflicting 9 on the group conditions of life, calculated to being about its physical destruction in whole or in part; and 10 11

12 WHEREAS, the Eli Wisen Genocide and Atrocities Prevention 13 Act of 2018 (Public Law 115-441) states that it is the policy of 14 the United States to regard the prevention of atrocities as in 15 its national interest"; and

WHEREAS, since 2017, the Government of the People's Republic of China has detained an estimated 1,800,000 Turkic Muslims, mostly Uyghurs, ethnic Kazakhs, Kyrgyz, and members of other Muslim minority groups, in internment camps without due process; and

WHEREAS, detained Uyghurs, ethnic Kazakhs, Kyrgyz, and members of other Muslim minority groups are reportedly tortured, coerced to disavow their religious beliefs and cultural practices, compelled to work in forced labor programs, and, in some cases, raped, subjected to involuntary forced abortion, sterilization, and forced organ harvesting; and

30 WHEREAS, sterilization rates in Xinjiang grew seven-fold 31 from 2016 to 2018 to more than 60,000 procedures; and

1 2 WHEREAS, nearly 500,000 Muslim children in Xinjiang have 3 been forcibly separated from their families and subjected to indoctrination and inhumane and degrading treatment in state-run 4 5 boarding schools; and 6 WHEREAS, Uyghurs, ethnic Kazakhs, Kyrgyz, and members of 7 other Muslim minority groups in the Xinjiang Uyghur Autonomous 8 9 Region are subjected to constant, unwarranted, and intrusive 10 mass surveillance through the use of new and emerging 11 technologies, including facial recognition software, artificial intelligence, and genetic testing; and 12 13 WHEREAS, between 2017 and 2019, an estimated 80,000 14 Uyghurs, ethnic Kazakhs, Kyrgyz, and members of other Muslim 15 16 minority groups were forcibly transferred out of Xinjiang Uyghur Autonomous Region to work in factories across China, which 17 18 raises serious concerns of forced labor being used in global supply chains; and 19 20 21 WHEREAS, the policies of the Government of the People's 22 Republic of China are in contravention of international human 23 rights instruments signed by that government; and 24 25 WHEREAS, as of January 2021 the Parliament of Canada, the Netherlands, and the United States government have officially 26 recognized the genocide of the Uyghurs, ethnic Kazakhs, Kyrgyz, 27 and members of other Muslim minority groups. 28 29 WHEREAS, Hawaii being a melting pot that consists of people 30 originating from all of over the world including people of 31 32 Chinese origin understand the plight that they are facing and feel their pain; and 33 34 35 WHEREAS, Hawaii and its legislative representatives have an earnest desire to uphold American ideals of freedom from 36 37 religious and racially motivated persecution; now therefore, 38 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 39 Thirty-first Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 40 41 of 2021, that this body encourages the People's Republic of

China to deal with and treat its ethnic Muslim minorities, 1 especially its Uyghur minority in a fair and humane manner as 2 per the tenants of Article 2 of the 1948 United Nations 3 Convention on the Prevention and the Punishment of the Crime of 4 Genocide; and 5

6 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this body encourages the US 7 Government and US-owned companies to form global partnerships to 8 ensure that businesses are not supporting, enabling, or 9 profiting from mass surveillance or forced labor, or any form of 10 human trafficking or inhuman treatment of Uyghurs, and other 11 ethnic Kazakhs, Kyrgyz, and members of other Muslim minority 12 groups in China; and 13

14 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this 15 Resolution be transmitted to the Majority Leader of the United 16 States Senate, the Speaker of the United States House of 17 Representatives, Hawaii's congressional delegation, the Governor 18 of Hawaii, the Speaker of the Hawaii's House of Representative, 19 Hawaii's Senate president, and all of Hawaii's legislators. 20
