HOUSE RESOLUTION

REQUESTING THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES, IN COORDINATION WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH, TO COLLECT DATA ON LESBIAN, GAY, BISEXUAL, TRANSGENDER, QUEER OR QUESTIONING, PANSEXUAL, ASEXUAL, GENDER NON-CONFORMING, AND INTERSEX YOUTH WHO ARE UNDER THE SUPERVISION OF THE COURTS AND THE HAWAII YOUTH CORRECTIONAL FACILITY.

WHEREAS, lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer or 1 questioning, pansexual, asexual, and gender non-conforming 2 (LGBTQ+) youth are historically overrepresented in juvenile 3 detention and correctional facilities in the juvenile system; 4 5 and 6 7 WHEREAS, intersex variation is rarely reported leading to missed information about LGBTQ+ and intersex youth; and 8 9 WHEREAS, LGBTQ+ youth, particularly LGBTQ+ youth of color, 10 face discrimination and stigma that leads to criminalization and 11 increased interactions with law enforcement and the criminal 12 justice system; and 13 14 WHEREAS, for some LGBTQ+ youth, especially LGBTQ+ youth of 15 color and transgender and non-conforming youth, these factors 16 play a large role in increasing their interactions with law 17 enforcement and ultimately their overrepresentation in the 18 juvenile and criminal justice systems; and 19 20 WHEREAS, LGBTQ+ youth in Hawaii experience stark physical 21 and mental health disparities, as reported in the Hawaii 22 Department of Health's 2017 and 2018 Sexual and Gender 23 Minorities Health Data reports; and 24 25 WHEREAS, the primary objective of the Kawailoa Youth and 26 Family Wellness Center, housed within the Hawaii Youth 27 Correctional Facility, is to prevent delinquency; and 28

WHEREAS, the Kawailoa Youth and Family Wellness Center 1 provides services and programs to meet the needs of youth or 2 young adults within the criminal justice system in addition to 3 at risk youth outside the criminal justice system; and 4 5 WHEREAS, specific data collected on sexual orientation, 6 gender identity, gender expression, and intersex variation 7 intersects with the statewide anti-discrimination work and could 8 inform decision-making processes such as identifying the 9 possible disproportionate impact of the criminal justice system 10 and evaluating the efficacy of work done to alleviate obstacles 11 unique to LGBTQ+ and intersex youth populations; now, therefore, 12 13 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 14 Thirty-first Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 15 of 2021, that the Department of Human Services, in coordination 16 with the Department of Health, is requested to collect data on 17 18 lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer or questioning, pansexual, asexual, gender non-conforming, and intersex youth 19 who are under the supervision of the courts and the Hawaii Youth 20 Correctional Facility; and 21 22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Public Safety 23 shall work with the Sexual and Gender Minority Workgroup within 24 the Department of Health to ensure that the data collection is 25 administered in accordance with LGBTQ+ and intersex data 26 collection best practices; and 27 28 29 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Resolution be transmitted to the Governor, Director of Public 30 Safety, Director of Health, and Director of Human Services. 31 32 33 34 OFFERED BY:
