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HOUSE RESOLUTION

URGING THE DEPARTMENT OF BUSINESS, ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT, AND TOURISM TO ESTABLISH A JOB CORPS PROGRAM TO HELP ADDRESS UNEMPLOYMENT IMPACTS OF THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC AND SUPPORT ECONOMIC DIVERSIFICATION.

WHEREAS, the federal Job Corps program is a no-cost 1 education and career technical training program administered by 2 the United States Department of Labor that helps young people 3 ages sixteen to twenty-four improve the quality of their lives 4 through career technical and academic training; and 5 6 7 WHEREAS, the Hawaii Job Corps Center supports the Job Corps program's mission to teach eligible young people the skills they 8 need to become employable and independent and place them in 9 10 meaningful jobs or further their education; and 11 WHEREAS, prior to the COVID-19 pandemic, Hawaii had one of 12 13 the lowest unemployment rates in the nation; and 14 WHEREAS, the pandemic has placed tens of thousands of 15 residents out of work and Hawaii now has among the nation's 16 highest rates of unemployment; and 17 18 WHEREAS, the Department of Labor and Industrial Relations 19 reported that in September 2019, Hawaii had a seasonally 20 adjusted unemployment rate of 2.7 percent, compared to a 21 national unemployment rate of 3.5 percent, and a year later, in 22 September 2020, Hawaii's unemployment rate was 15.1 percent, 23 compared to a national unemployment rate of 7.9 percent; and 24 25 26 WHEREAS, these figures highlight the need for increased and 27 diverse workforce development initiatives; and 28 29 WHEREAS, tourism, the State's largest industry, has dropped 30 considerably because of the pandemic, providing a unique

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opportunity to build a more resilient, equitable, and 1 diversified economy; and 2 3 4 WHEREAS, the Civilian Conservation Corps established after the Great Depression was a federal work relief program to help 5 employ Americans on conservation projects, alleviate economic 6 7 distress, and support the protection and responsible development of natural resources and agricultural use; and 8 9 WHEREAS, the State is mandated to be powered by one hundred 10 percent renewable energy and to sequester more carbon than the 11 State emits by 2045; and 12 13 WHEREAS, the State is also mandated to transition cesspools 14 15 to septic systems by 2050; and 16 17 WHEREAS, to support a comprehensive economic recovery, the State must invest in our community and emerging economic sectors 18 and provide residents with the education and training 19 opportunities needed to succeed; and 20 21 WHEREAS, the creation of a state-run job corps program 22 would provide residents of all ages who have been economically 23 impacted by the pandemic with opportunities to learn new skills 24 and increase their prospects of employment within resiliency and 25 green sectors, including local agriculture, conservation, 26 climate adaptation, renewable energy, cesspool conversion, and 27 technology; and 28 29 30 WHEREAS, Aloha Connects Innovation and Kupu 'Aina Corps are two workforce development initiatives launched by the State with 31 Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act 32 33 funds, and serve as examples the State can integrate and build upon in establishing its own job corps program; and 34 35 WHEREAS, "From Today to Tomorrow: A Talent Roadmap to 36 Support Economic Recovery" by the Hawaii Executive 37 Collaborative, provides a framework to establish a job corps 38 program by outlining a talent development strategy through 39 expanding work-based learning, retraining, credentialing 40

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programs, industry-driven solutions, and partnerships; now, 1 therefore, 2 3 4 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the Thirty-first Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 5 of 2021, that the Department of Business, Economic Development, 6 7 and Tourism is urged to establish a job corps program to help address unemployment impacts of the COVID-19 pandemic and 8 support economic diversification; and 9 10 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Business, 11 Economic Development, and Tourism consult with and seek advice 12 from the Workforce Development Council in its efforts to 13 establish the program; and 14 15 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Business, 16 Economic Development, and Tourism identify public-private 17 partnerships and outline components of a job corps program that 18 focuses on resiliency and green sector jobs; and 19 20 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Department of Business, 21 Economic Development, and Tourism report to the Legislature no 22 later than twenty days prior to the convening of the 2022 23 Regular Session on the Department's recommendations on funding 24 sources and program structure for the job corps program; and 25 26 27 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that certified copies of this Resolution be transmitted to the Governor; Director of Business, 28 Economic Development, and Tourism; and Chair of the Workforce 29 Development Council. 30 31 32 33 OFFERED BY:

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
