HOUSE RESOLUTION

URGING THE EMPOWERMENT OF YOUNG WOMEN BY ANNUALLY RECOGNIZING OCTOBER 11 AS THE INTERNATIONAL DAY OF THE GIRL.

1	WHEREAS, women's rights are human rights; and
2 3	WHEREAS, the Legislature recognizes that girl children
4	worldwide are often at greater risk of being exposed to and
5 6	encountering various forms of discrimination and violence; and
0 7	WHEREAS, some of these forms of discrimination and violence
8	include cultural, social, sexual and economic exploitation,
9	abuse, rape, incest, honor-related crimes and harmful
10 11	traditional practices, such as female infanticide, child and forced marriages, prenatal sex selection, and female genital
11	mutilation; and

14	WHEREAS, this discrimination and violence often results in
15	less access for girls to quality education, nutrition, and
16 17	physical and mental health care; and
18	WHEREAS, this severe disadvantage leads to girls enjoying
19	fewer of the rights, opportunities, and benefits of childhood
20	and adolescence than boys enjoy; thus limiting their potential
21	for full development and leaving them open to further discrimination, violence, and neglect; and
22 23	discrimination, viorence, and negrect; and
24	WHEREAS, the empowerment of girls is crucial in breaking
25	the cycle of discrimination and violence and in promoting and
26	protecting the full and effective enjoyment of their rights; and
27 28	WHEREAS, the empowerment and advancement of girls,
28 29	guarantees women the possibility of realizing their full
30	potential in society and shaping their lives in accordance with
31	their own aspirations; and

33 34	WHEREAS, empowering girls requires the active support and engagement of their parents, legal guardians, families, boys,
34 35	and men, as well as the wider community; and

WHEREAS, in 2011, the United Nations designated October 1 11th as the International Day of the Girl Child, to be observed 2 every year; and 3 4 WHEREAS, Governor Iqe proclaimed October 11, 2020, as Day 5 of the Girl Child, asking the people of Hawaii to build 6 awareness of the challenges faced by girls in the United States 7 and around the world, end gender discrimination, support more 8 opportunities for girls, safeguard their rights, and encourage 9 their full social, political, and economic participation; now, 10 therefore, 11 12 BE IT RESOLVED by the House of Representatives of the 13 Thirty-first Legislature of the State of Hawaii, Regular Session 14 15 of 2021, that October 11 be annually recognized in Hawaii as the International Day of the Girl; and 16 17 18 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that a certified copy of this 19 Resolution be transmitted to the Governor. 20 21 22 OFFERED BY:
