A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EFFECTIVE GOVERNMENT OPERATIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the coronavirus
disease 2019 pandemic highlighted the need to modernize
government to meet the urgent needs of the community. Further,
the pandemic has highlighted the need for greater flexibility,
responsiveness, transparency, and accountability in how
government interfaces with and responds to the community.

7 The legislature also finds that many current structures and 8 processes have hindered or challenged agencies in their ability 9 to responsively, promptly, effectively, and efficiently provide government services that the public demands. Further, the 10 11 executive branch departments, particularly those at the 12 administrative and division levels, are often hindered in 13 modernizing and realigning their programmatic and staffing 14 structures because of the processes required to effectuate 15 organizational change, collectively known as a "program 16 reorganization" or "reorg".

1 The legislature finds that program reorganization can take 2 two years or more to complete and often is not approved until 3 long after the original intent has lapsed. Further, the 4 legislature found in response to the pandemic that these 5 processes prevented expeditious staffing and proactive 6 adjustments needed to quickly respond to community needs.

7 Finally, the legislature finds that time is of the essence 8 to support the agencies to restructure and realign their 9 programs to quickly and effectively meet the needs of the 10 community. Further, the current and continuing economic 11 downturn and budget shortfall facing the State necessitates 12 significantly more flexibility and public accountability. 13 Government programs must be allowed and mandated to reorganize 14 to more readily and effectively manage and maximize the use of 15 scarce resources to address the complex and growing needs of our 16 communities.

17 The purpose of this Act is to establish a reorganization 18 pilot project within the department of health to shift and 19 organize the functions, positions, and funding to effectuate an 20 organization that cost-effectively and more efficiently provides 21 needed services to the public.

1 SECTION 2. (a) The department of health shall establish a 2 two-year reorganization pilot project to reorganize the four divisions within the department of health behavioral health 3 services administration. 4 In reorganizing the behavioral health services 5 (b) 6 administration, the department of health shall consult with the 7 department of budget and finance and department of human 8 resources development. 9 (C) The reorganization pilot project shall: 10 Shift and organize the functions, positions, and (1) 11 funding to effectuate an organization that cost-12 effectively and more efficiently provides needed 13 services to the public; Identify the processes to most efficiently and cost-14 (2) 15 effectively restructure and realign functions, 16 staffing, and funding to meet the needs of the 17 community; 18 (3) Be exempt from chapters 103D and 103F for purposes of 19 realigning contracts with departmental priority 20 services; and



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1	(4)	Conduct an expedited reorganization, including
2		consultation with the appropriate bargaining units,
3		with the assistance of the department of human
4		resources, to address affected employees, maintaining,
5		to the extent possible, their functions as reflected
6		in their current positions and current salary.
7	(d)	The reorganization pilot project shall end on June 30,
8	2023.	
9	SECT	TON 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
