A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HAWAII COMMUNITY-BASED ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT TECHNICAL AND FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 210D-11, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 "S210D-11 Grants; conditions and qualifications. (a)
- 4 Grants shall be made for amounts not to exceed \$100,000 for each
- 5 applicant. Applications for grants shall be made to the
- 6 department and contain such information as the department shall
- 7 require by rules adopted pursuant to chapter 91. At a minimum,
- 8 the applicant must show that:
- 9 (1) The grant shall be used exclusively for community-
- 10 based economic development activities, a community-
- 11 based business or enterprise, or the provision of
- 12 technical assistance [to community based
- organizations], consistent with the purposes of this
- 14 chapter;

1	(2)	The community-based business or enterprise shall have
2		applied for or received all applicable licenses and
3		permits;
4	(3)	The applicant shall comply with all applicable federal
5		and state laws prohibiting discrimination against any
6		person on the basis of race, color, national origin,
7		religion, creed, sex, age, sexual orientation,
8		disability, or any other characteristic protected
9		under applicable federal or state law;
10	(4)	The grant shall not be used for purposes of
11		entertainment or perquisites;
12	(5)	The applicant shall comply with other requirements as
13		the department may prescribe;
14	(6)	All activities and improvements undertaken with funds
15		received shall comply with all applicable federal,
16		state, and county statutes and ordinances, including
17		applicable building codes and agency rules;
18	(7)	The applicant shall indemnify and save harmless the
19		State of Hawaii and its officers, agents, and
20		employees from and against any and all claims arising
21		out of or resulting from activities carried out or

8	(b)	To r	eceive a grant under this section for community-			
9	based eco	based economic development activities, a community-based				
10	enterprise or business, or the provision of technical assistance					
11	[to community-based organizations], an applicant shall:					
12	(1)	Be e	ither:			
13		(A)	A profit subsidiary of a nonprofit community-			
14			based organization incorporated under the laws of			
15			the State;			
16		(B)	A nonprofit community-based organization			
17			determined to be exempt from federal income			
18			taxation by the Internal Revenue Service;			
19		(C)	A cooperative association; or			
20		(D)	An organization providing technical assistance			
21			[to community based organizations];			

1	(2)	In the case of a nonprofit organization, have a
2		governing board whose members have no material
3		conflict of interest and serve without compensation,
4		have bylaws or policies that describe the manner in
5		which business is conducted and policies relating to
6		nepotism and management of potential conflict of
7		interest situations, and employ or contract with no
8		two or more members of a family or kin of the first or
9		second degree unless specifically permitted by the
10		department;
11	(3)	Agree to make available to the department all records
12		the applicant may have relating to the grant, to allow
13		state agencies to monitor the applicant's compliance
14		with the purpose of this chapter; and
15	(4)	Establish, to the satisfaction of the department, that
16		sufficient funds are available for the effective
17		operation of the activity, business, enterprise, or
18		technical assistance for the purpose for which the
19		grant is awarded."
