#### JUSTIFICATION SHEET

DEPARTMENT:

Business, Economic Development, and Tourism

TITLE:

A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO HOUSING.

PURPOSE:

Repeal the Downpayment Loan Assistance Program and the Homebuyers' Club Program.

MEANS:

Repeal chapter 201H, part III, subparts F and G, Hawaii Revised Statutes.

JUSTIFICATION:

The Downpayment Loan Assistance Program and the Homebuyers' Club Program are not costeffective, no longer necessary, and therefore should be repealed as a costsaving measure.

The Downpayment Loan Assistance Program was established in 1995 to provide eligible first-time homebuyers with down payment loans. However, due to lack of funding, has only ever made nine down payment loans since its inception. More recently, the Hawaii Housing Finance and Development Corporation has alternative forms of assistance for first-time homebuyers that are more cost-effective.

The Homebuyers' Club Program was originally established in 1993, before U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development-approved nonprofit housing counseling agencies were established statewide. Nonprofit housing counseling agencies provide homeownership counseling to first-time homebuyers more cost-effectively, making the program obsolete.
