<u>S.B. NO. 1107</u> JAN 2 7 2021 A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HAWAII EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 127A-18, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended to read as follows:

3 "[{]\$127A-18[}] Mitigation of hazardous situations. (a) Even in the absence of an emergency or disaster, the governor 4 5 may authorize designated state employees, agents, contractors, 6 or representatives to enter private property at reasonable times 7 to mitigate situations deemed by the governor to be hazardous to the health and safety of the public; provided that this section 8 9 shall be applicable only to the following actions: 10 (1) Cutting, trimming, or removing dangerous trees or 11 branches that pose a hazard to other properties; 12 (2) Stabilizing or removing unstable rock and soil

13 hazards; [or]

14 (3) Cleaning streams and waterways to mitigate or prevent15 flooding; or

- 16 (4) Additional natural hazards;
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1 provided further that at least ten days' written notice shall be provided to the landowner and to the occupier of the private 2 3 property of the governor's intention to authorize designated 4 state employees, agents, contractors, or representatives to 5 enter the property to mitigate the hazardous situation; provided further that the landowner or occupier shall be given a 6 7 reasonable opportunity to mitigate the hazardous situation 8 without assistance of the State before designated state 9 employees, agents, contractors, or representatives may enter the 10 property.

(b) Written notice sent to the landowner's last known address by certified mail, postage prepaid, return receipt requested, shall be deemed sufficient notice. If land ownership cannot be determined, notice shall be given once in a daily or weekly publication of general circulation in the county in which any action or proposed action will be taken.

(c) If entry is refused, the governor may apply to the district court in the circuit in which the property is located for a warrant to enter the premises. The district court may issue a warrant directing the chief of the appropriate county police to assist the governor in gaining entry onto the premises during regular working hours or at other reasonable times.

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1	(d) The governor may seek recovery and reimbursement, by
2	appropriate proceedings, of all costs and expenses incurred in
3	the mitigation of a hazardous situation under this section, and
4	any costs and expenses imposed against any landowner shall be a
5	lien upon the landowner's property.
6	(e) This section shall take effect only upon authorization
7	and funding for personnel to administer the program.
8	(f) There is established in the state treasury the hazard
9	mitigation special fund, into which shall be deposited:
10	(1) All revenues from any recovery or reimbursement
11	pursuant to this section; and
12	(2) Appropriations made by the legislature for deposit
13	into the fund.
14	(g) Moneys in the hazard mitigation special fund shall be
15	used for personnel costs and operating and administrative costs
16	deemed necessary by the agency to administer this section."
17	SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
18	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
19	SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

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JUSTIFICATION SHEET

DEPARTMENT:	Defense
TITLE:	A BILL FOR AN ACT RELATING TO THE HAWAII EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AGENCY.
PURPOSE:	The purpose of this bill is to establish the Hazard Mitigation Special Fund to allow the Hawaii Emergency Management Agency the ability to monitor its own hazard mitigation projects.
MEANS:	Amend section 127A-18, Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS).
JUSTIFICATION:	Section 127A-18 authorizes the Governor (in the absence of an emergency or disaster) to designate state employees, agents, contractors, or representatives to enter private property at reasonable times to mitigate situations deemed by the Governor to be hazardous to the health and safety of the public for situations related to (1) cutting, trimming, or removing dangerous trees or branches that pose a hazard to other properties; (2) stabilizing or removing unstable rock and soil hazards; (3) cleaning streams and waterways to mitigate or prevent flooding; or (4) Additional natural hazards. Establishing a mitigation special fund will allow the Hawaii Emergency Management Agency to manage hazardous mitigation and meet the intent of section 127A-1, and allow the use of legislative appropriations, other mitigation grants, and recovery and reimbursements.

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Additionally, other states support hazard mitigation funding and have garnered successful results.

Impact on the public: The establishment of the Hazardous Mitigation Special Fund will increase public health and safety by providing funds to address the three (3) hazardous mitigation conditions defined in section 127A-18.

Impact on the department and other agencies: Positive impact to the Department of Defense & HIEMA and other agencies, such as the Department of Transportation and public utilities by providing specific funding to address hazardous mitigation and improve response time to roads and utilities that may otherwise be affected. No known negative impact to other departments.
