RELATING TO THE STATE DISASTER RECOVERY PROGRAM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Disaster recovery is a complex and long-term
 process that involves a range of activities and many
 participants. Recovery operations begin shortly after a
 disaster occurs and can continue for many years. It involves
 short-term restoration of essential community functions and
 long-term recovery planning and coordination.

7 State, public, and private organizations share in providing 8 for the public's health and safety. It is essential that the 9 response, recovery, and mitigation activities of all parties be 10 fully aligned.

11 The purpose of this Act is to enhance the capacity of the 12 government, relevant agencies, and the community to recover from 13 the impacts of disasters by establishing the state disaster 14 recovery program as overseen by the state disaster recovery 15 coordinator. The state disaster recovery coordinator position 16 herein described was funded through the governor's executive 17 budget in fiscal biennium 2019-2021.

| PURPOSE: | To enhance the capacity of the government, relevant agencies, and the community to recover from the impacts of disasters. Establishes the State Disaster Recovery Program and Framework and describes the role of the State Disaster Recovery Coordinator (SDRC). This legislation formally includes a State Disaster Recovery Framework (SDRF) in section 127A- 3(e), Hawaii Revised Statutes. |
| MEANS: | Add one new section to chapter 127A and amend section 127A-3(e), Hawaii Revised Statutes (HRS). |
| JUSTIFICATION: | Establishing the State Disaster Recovery Program and Framework and describing the State Disaster Recovery Coordinator will enhance the capacity of the government, relevant agencies, and the community to recover from the impacts of disasters. This bill will facilitate the identification, coordination, and delivery of recovery assistance needed to augment statewide recovery resources and efforts. |
| | The State Disaster Recovery Framework, as led and implemented by the State Disaster Recovery Coordinator, provides the structure and builds long-term capacity for delivery of recovery programs and actions. |
| | The bill clarifies that the SDRC will maintain priorities on behalf of and report to the Governor on disaster recovery operations, and recommend policies, programs, and plans to the |

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Governor. This bill formally establishes a state framework that is modeled after the National Disaster Recovery Framework (NDRF).
