A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE STATE DISASTER RECOVERY PROGRAM.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that disaster recovery is
- 2 a complex and long-term process that involves a range of
- 3 activities and many participants. Recovery operations begin
- 4 shortly after a disaster occurs and can continue for many years.
- 5 It involves short-term restoration of essential community
- 6 functions and long-term recovery planning and coordination.
- 7 The legislature further finds that State, public, and
- 8 private organizations share in providing for the public's health
- 9 and safety. It is essential that the response, recovery, and
- 10 mitigation activities of all parties be fully aligned.
- 11 The purpose of this Act is to enhance the capacity of the
- 12 government, relevant agencies, and the community to recover from
- 13 the impacts of disasters by establishing the state disaster
- 14 recovery program as overseen by the state disaster recovery
- 15 coordinator.

1	SECT	TON 2. Chapter 127A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended b	y adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to be read as follows:	
4	" <u>§12</u>	7A- State disaster recovery coordinator; duties and
5	powers.	(a) The state disaster recovery coordinator shall
6	report to	the governor, oversee the state disaster recovery
7	program a	nd framework, and shall:
8	(1)	Establish and maintain recovery priorities and
9		strategy on behalf of the governor;
10	(2)	Convene and provide executive level coordination for
11		state agencies working on the federal disaster
12		recovery and reconstruction programs and alignment of
13		<pre>funding;</pre>
14	(3)	Facilitate disaster recovery coordination and
15		collaboration between the federal, state, and local
16		governments; the private sector; and voluntary, faith-
17		based, and community organizations;
18	(4)	Serve as the primary contact with the federal disaster
19		recovery coordinator to address recovery needs;
20	(5)	Promote a unified communications strategy with state
21		and local partners; and

1	(6) Develop and promulgate interagency coordination plans
2	to drive long-term recovery from disasters.
3	(b) The state disaster recovery coordinator shall conduct
4	a comprehensive review of recovery plans, policies, and
5	decisions as required by this section and submit a report to the
6	governor and the legislature prior to the convening of the
7	regular session of 2022 and every odd year thereafter. Each
8	stakeholder agency involved is responsible to keep applicable
9	portions of recovery plans, together with annexes and appendices
10	thereto, accurate and up to date."
11	SECTION 3. Section 127A-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
12	amended by amending subsection (e) to read as follows:
13	"(e) The agency shall perform emergency management
14	functions within the territorial limits of the State. In
15	performing its duties, the agency shall:
16	(1) Prepare a state comprehensive emergency management
17	plan, which shall include a state disaster recovery
18	program and framework and be integrated into and
19	coordinated with the emergency management plans of the
20	federal government. The plan shall be integrated by a
21	continuous, integrated comprehensive emergency

1		management program. The plan shall contain provisions
2		to ensure that the State is prepared for emergencies
3		and minor, major, and catastrophic disasters. In
4		preparing and maintaining the plan, the agency shall
5		work closely with agencies and organizations with
6		emergency management responsibilities;
7	(2)	Assign lead and support responsibilities to state
8		agencies and personnel for emergency functions and
9		other support activities;
10	(3)	Adopt standards and requirements for county emergency
11		management plans. The standards and requirements
12		shall ensure that county plans are coordinated and
13		consistent with the state comprehensive emergency
14		management plan;
15	(4)	Make recommendations to the legislature, building code
16		organizations, and counties for zoning, building, and
17		other land use controls; and other preparedness,
18		prevention, and mitigation measures designed to
19		eliminate emergencies or reduce their impact;
20	(5)	Anticipate trends and promote innovations that will
21		enhance the emergency management system;

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2		shall include intensive public educational campaigns
3		on emergency preparedness issues, including but not
4		limited to the personal responsibility of individual
5		citizens to be self-sufficient for up to fourteen days
6		following a natural or human-caused disaster;
7	(7)	Coordinate federal, state, and local emergency
8		management activities and take all other steps,
9		including the partial or full mobilization of
10		emergency management forces and organizations in
11		advance of an actual emergency, to ensure the
12		availability of adequately trained and equipped forces
13		of emergency management personnel before, during, and
14		after emergencies and disasters;
15	(8)	Implement training programs to improve the ability of
16		state and local emergency management personnel to
17		prepare and implement emergency management plans and
18		programs. This shall include a continuous training

program for agencies and individuals that will be

called on to perform key roles in state and local

post-disaster response and recovery efforts and for

(6) Institute statewide public awareness programs.

1		local government personnel on federal and state post-
2		disaster response and recovery strategies and
3		procedures;
4	(9)	Adopt standards and requirements for state agency
5		emergency operating procedures and periodically review
6		emergency operating procedures of state agencies and
7		recommend revisions as needed to ensure consistency
8		with the state comprehensive emergency management plan
9		and program; and
10	(10)	Coordinate, in advance whenever possible, such
11		executive orders, proclamations, and rules for
12		issuance by the governor as are necessary or
13		appropriate for coping with emergencies and
14		disasters."
15	SECT	ION 4. New statutory material is underscored.
16	SECT	ION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
