5	shall submit annual reports to the legislature no later than

9	each service or program, [and] the results of the services or
10	programs funded[-], and all fiscal transactions and expenses of
11	each service or program; provided that the director of human
12	services shall conduct an immediate audit of the office of youth
13	services if the office of youth services fails to submit an
14	annual report on the fiscal transactions and expenses of each
15	service or program in a timely manner.
16	(d) To this end, on July 1, 1991, this office shall assume
17	the responsibilities for juvenile corrections functions, which
18	were temporarily placed in the department of corrections
19	pursuant to Act 338, Session Laws of Hawaii 1987. These

Report Title:

Office of Youth Services Revolving Fund; Commercial Enterprise Vocational Programs; Annual Reports; Director of Human Services; Audit

Description:

Permits individual vocational programs within the purview of the office of youth services to engage in commercial enterprises, including the sale of goods and services, for self-sustainability purposes, for young adults only. Establishes the office of youth services revolving fund. Requires the office of youth services to submit annual reports to the legislature on the fiscal transactions and expenses of each service or program. Requires the director of human services to conduct an audit of the office of youth services if the annual fiscal transactions and expenses reports are not submitted in a timely manner. Effective 7/1/2060. (HD1)

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
