RELATING TO HOSPITAL LICENSING.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to authorize the 2 department of health to recognize additional nationally 3 recognized accreditation or certification organizations to 4 demonstrate a hospital's compliance with all licensing 5 inspections required by the State. Although hospitals generally 6 use the Joint Commission for accreditation, other organizations 7 are available and are accepted by the U.S. Centers for Medicare 8 and Medicaid Services (CMS). These include but are not limited 9 to the Accreditation Association for Hospitals and Health 10 Systems/Healthcare Facilities Accreditation Program, the Center 11 for Improvement in Healthcare Quality, and DNV GL - Healthcare 12 National Integrated Accreditation for Healthcare Orgnaizations. 13 SECTION 2. Section 321-14.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 14 amended to read as follows:

15 "\$321-14.5 Hospitals; licensing. (a) All hospitals shall
16 be licensed by the department to ensure the health, safety, and
17 welfare of the individuals placed therein.

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1 The director shall adopt rules in accordance with (b) 2 chapter 91 that shall provide for the licensing of hospitals. 3 The rules may provide that accreditation by [the joint (C) 4 commission] nationally recognized accreditation or certification organizations demonstrates a hospital's compliance with all 5 6 licensing inspections required by the State. The rules may 7 exempt a hospital from a licensing inspection on a continuing 8 basis throughout the term of the accreditation or certification 9 under the following conditions: 10 The hospital provides the department with a certified (1)11 copy of the hospital's official accreditation or 12 certification report [from-the joint commission on accreditation of healthcare organizations]; 13 14 (2) The hospital continuously holds full accreditation or 15 certification [by The Joint Commission]; and 16 (3) The hospital holds a current and valid state license. 17 (d) The rules shall provide that the department may 18 conduct inspections and investigations of exempt hospitals to 19 investigate complaints, follow up on adverse accreditation 20 findings, or conduct periodic validation surveys. 21 (e) Information contained in reports of survey and 22 official accreditation letters made by the [the joint commission

4	(f) All other records maintained by the department shall
5	be governed by chapter 92F."
