## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE BOILER AND ELEVATOR SAFETY LAW.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 397-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 "[{] §397-2[}] Findings and purpose. The legislature finds
- 4 that the Hawaii occupational safety and health law does not
- 5 adequately provide for the safe operation and use of [boilers,
- 6 pressure systems, pressure retaining items, amusement rides,
- 7 and elevators and kindred equipment. The purpose of this law is
- 8 to assure the safe operation and use of such apparatus in
- 9 Hawaii."
- 10 SECTION 2. Section 397-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 11 amended by adding three new definitions to be appropriately
- 12 inserted and to read as follows:
- ""Amusement ride" means a mechanically or electrically
- 14 operated device designed to carry passengers in various modes
- 15 and used for entertainment and amusement.
- 16 "Permit to operate" means a certificate issued by the
- 17 department that indicates that the pressure retaining item,

17		(B) Keep adequate and complete records of the type,
18		size, location, identification data, and
19		inspection findings for [boilers, pressure
20		systems, pressure retaining items, amusement
21		rides, and elevators and kindred equipment

3	(3)	The department shall formulate definitions and adopt
4		and enforce standards and rules pursuant to chapter 91
5		that may be necessary for carrying out this chapter;

9		emergency temporary standards or upon another date
10		that may be specified in the notice. An emergency
11		temporary standard may be adopted, if the director

16		(B) That the emergency temporary standard is
17		necessary to protect the public or individuals

19		Emergency temporary standards shall be effective until

10	operate["] to any user, owner, or contractor who
11	demonstrates that the user, owner, or contractor
12	is proceeding in good faith to abate all
13	nonconforming conditions mentioned in department
14	orders and the [ <del>boilers, pressure systems,</del> ]
15	pressure retaining items, amusement rides, and
16	elevators and kindred equipment are safe to
17	operate; and
18	(D) The department shall establish criteria for the
19	periodic reinspection and renewal of the permits
20	to operate, and may provide for the issuance of
21	temporary permits to operate while any

2		retaining item, amusement ride, and elevator and
3		kindred equipment are being brought into full
4		compliance with the applicable standards and
5		rules adopted pursuant to this chapter; provided
6		that the period between an initial safety
7		inspection or the inspection used as a basis for
8		the issuance of a permit to operate, and any
9		subsequent inspection of elevators and kindred
10		equipment shall not exceed one year;
11	(7)	No person shall operate a [boiler, pressure system,]
12		pressure retaining item, amusement ride, or elevator
13		and kindred equipment that [are] is required to be
14		inspected by this chapter or by any rule adopted
15		pursuant to this chapter, except as necessary to
16		install, repair, or test, unless a permit to operate

20		user, or other person affected thereby, may grant time

7	reasonable fees to be charged for inspection, examination, and
8	other services rendered and for permits, certificates, or
9	licenses, the issuance of which are required by this chapter or
10	by any rules of the department adopted pursuant to this
11	chapter[, and]. The fee schedule shall include fees for:
12	(1) Inspections by the department of any [boiler, pressure
13	system, pressure retaining item, amusement ride, and
14	elevator and kindred equipment for which a permit or
15	certificate is required for its installation, repair,
16	alteration, operation, or use, and which is required
17	to be inspected by this chapter or by any rules of the
18	department; and
19	(2) Examination of any person applying for permits,
20	certificates, or licenses as required by this chapter
21	or by any rules of the department.

6	amended to read as follows:
7	"§397-6 Safety inspection by qualified inspectors. (a)
8	All safety inspections required under this chapter of [boilers
9	and pressure systems] pressure retaining items shall be
10	performed by deputy boiler inspectors in the employ of the
11	department who are qualified boiler inspectors and, when
12	authorized by the director, may be performed by special
13	inspectors who are qualified boiler inspectors in the employ of
14	insurance companies insuring boilers or pressure systems in this
15	State.
16	(b) A qualified boiler inspector is a person eligible for
17	or in possession of a valid commission issued by the National
18	Board of Boiler and Pressure Vessel Inspectors, who has
19	satisfied the requirements established by the department, and
20	who has received from the director or the director's authorized

- 1 agent briefings and instructions regarding the rules pertaining
- 2 to boilers and pressure systems in this State.
- 3 (c) All safety inspections required under this chapter of
- 4 elevators and kindred equipment, and amusement rides and the
- 5 premises appurtenant thereto, shall be performed by deputy
- 6 elevator inspectors of the department who are qualified elevator
- 7 inspectors and who are employed primarily for purposes of
- 8 elevator and related inspection work.
- 9 (d) A qualified elevator inspector is a person who meets
- 10 the criteria of the American Society of Mechanical Engineers and
- 11 the standards for the qualification of elevator inspectors of
- 12 the American National Standards Institute and has satisfied
- 13 requirements established by the department of labor and
- 14 industrial relations."
- 15 SECTION 6. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 16 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 17 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

## Report Title:

Boiler and Elevator Safety Law; Permits to Operate

## Description:

Authorizes the director of labor and industrial relations to prohibit the operation of pressure retaining items, amusement rides, and elevators and kindred equipment if inspection fees or fines are not paid timely. Deletes the boiler and elevator fee schedule. Defines "amusement ride", "permit to operation", and "pressure retaining item". Replaces "boiler, pressure items" with "pressure retaining items" throughout chapter 397, Hawaii Revised Statutes. (SD1)
