## A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO EMPLOYMENT SECURITY.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 383-1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended as follows: 3 By amending the definition of "benefit year" to read: 1. 4 ""Benefit year" [<del>with respect to any individual means the</del> 5 one-year period beginning with the first day of the first week 6 with respect to which the individual first files a valid claim 7 for benefits and thereafter the one-year period beginning with 8 the first day of the first week with respect to which the 9 individual next files a valid claim for benefits after the 10 termination of the individual's last preceding benefit year. 11 Any claim for benefits made in accordance with section 383-32 12 shall be deemed a "valid claim" for the purpose of this 13 paragraph if the individual has satisfied the conditions 14 required under section 383-29(a)(5). Nothing in sections 383-29 15 and 383-30, except section 383-29(a)(5), shall affect the filing 16 of a "valid claim" or the establishment of a "benefit year". 17 For the purposes of this paragraph a week with respect to which

Whenever the ratio of the current reserve fund to the 11 (1)12 adequate reserve fund is greater than 1.69, 13 contribution rate schedule A shall apply. Whenever the ratio of the current reserve fund to the 14 (2) 15 adequate reserve fund is 1.3 to 1.69, contribution 16 rate schedule B shall apply. 17 (3) Whenever the ratio of the current reserve fund to the adequate reserve fund is 1.0 to 1.29, contribution 18 19 rate schedule C shall apply.

3 SECTION 4. Section 383-69, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
4 amended to read as follows:

5 "§383-69 Procedure for rate determination. The department 6 [of labor and industrial relations], as soon as is reasonably 7 possible in each period, shall make its classification of 8 employers for the period and notify each employer of the 9 employer's rate of contributions for the period as determined 10 pursuant to sections 383-63 to 383-69. The determination shall 11 become conclusive and binding upon the employer unless the 12 employer appeals the determination by filing a written notice of 13 appeal within fifteen days after the mailing of notice of the 14 determination to the employer's last known address. The appeal 15 shall be heard by the referee in accordance with applicable provisions of sections 383-38 and 383-39 but no employer shall 16 17 have standing, in any proceeding involving the employer's rate 18 of contributions or contribution liability, to contest the 19 chargeability to the employer's account of any benefits paid in 20 accordance with a determination, redetermination, or decision 21 pursuant to sections 383-31 to 383-43; provided that the

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1 services on the basis of which the benefits were found to be chargeable did not constitute services performed in employment 2 3 for the employer and only if the employer was not a party to the 4 determination, redetermination, or decision, or to any other 5 proceedings under this chapter in which the character of the services was determined. The referee's determination shall 6 7 become final unless a proceeding for judicial review in the 8 manner provided in chapter 91 is commenced in the circuit court 9 of the judicial circuit in which the employer resides or has the 10 employer's principal place of business or in the circuit court 11 of the first judicial circuit. An appeal may be taken from the 12 decision of the circuit court to the intermediate appellate 13 court, subject to chapter 602. Notwithstanding any other 14 provision of this chapter to the contrary, to address the 15 disruptions caused by the coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) 16 pandemic, the director may modify the annual contribution rate 17 computation method for calendar years 2021 and 2022 for all employers to omit benefits charged to their accounts." 18 19 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 20 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

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SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval;
 provided that sections 3 and 4 of this Act shall take effect
 retroactive to January 1, 2021.



Report Title: Employment Security; Unemployment Compensation Trust Fund

#### Description:

Sets the rate of employer contributions to the State Unemployment Compensation Trust Fund for calendar years 2021, 2022, and 2023, at schedules D, F, and G, respectively, under the Hawaii employer security law. Allows the director of labor and industrial relations to modify the annual contribution rate computation method for all employers for calendar years 2021 and 2022, by omitting from the calculation, benefits charged against their accounts. Amends the definitions of benefit year and week. Conforms the manner of filing partial unemployment benefits claims to those of total and part-total unemployment benefits claims. Effective date of amendments to the contribution rate schedule and computation method is retroactive to 1/1/2021. (SD1)
