RELATING TO OCEAN RECREATION COMMERCIAL PERMITS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. Section 200-10, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 2 amended by amending subsection (f) to read as follows: 3 "(f) Any person who owns an interest in a corporation or 4 other business entity or is part of a controlled group 5 possessing a valid commercial permit issued by the department, 6 in accordance with rules adopted by the chairperson pursuant to 7 chapter 91, may transfer any or all stock or other interest to 8 another person without terminating the right of the corporation 9 or business entity to retain or renew [its] the corporation or 10 commercial entity's commercial permit or any other permit issued to [it] the corporation or commercial entity by the department; 11 12 provided that: 13 (1)The corporation or business entity has been engaged in 14 the same commercial vessel activity, as defined in 15 section 200-9, for a minimum of one year; 16 The seller shall pay the department a business (2)

17 transfer fee based on the passenger-carrying capacity



of the vessels owned or operated by the corporation or business entity as provided by rules adopted by the chairperson pursuant to chapter 91, except for transfers of stock or interest in a corporation or other business entity between spouses or firstgeneration lineal descendants; and
(3) In the case of a controlled group, the transferee

8 shall retain eighty per cent control of the9 transferor.

10 Any person possessing a commercial permit shall be required to 11 meet minimum revenue standards, as a condition of retaining or 12 renewing the commercial permit.

13 When an application for renewal of a commercial permit is 14 made at least sixty days prior to expiration of the commercial 15 permit, the department shall review the application and, within 16 thirty days of receipt of the application, [shall] renew the 17 permit or notify the applicant that the application is 18 incomplete or cannot be renewed and explain any reasons for 19 nonrenewal. Within thirty days of receipt of the applicant's 20 amended application, the department shall either renew the

permit or notify the applicant that the permit will not be
 renewed.

3 If the holder of a commercial permit fails to timely obtain renewal of a commercial permit, the holder of the permit shall 4 automatically be granted a thirty-day extension from the date of 5 6 the existing permit's expiration to obtain a permit renewal. 7 Except as provided in section 200-37(1), beginning on 8 July 1, 2021, all new commercial permits issued for any type of 9 commercial ocean recreation activity that are not renewals of permits initially issued before July 1, 2021, may be issued by 10 11 the department at public auction." 12 SECTION 2. This Act does not affect rights and duties that matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were 13

14 begun before its effective date.

15 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed16 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

17 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2021.
