A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO PROCUREMENT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 103D-307, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended to read as follows:

3 "[+]\$103D-307[+] Emergency procurements. (a) The head of
4 a purchasing agency may obtain a good, service, or construction
5 essential to meet an emergency by means other than specified in
6 this chapter when the following conditions exist:

A situation of an unusual or compelling urgency 7 (1) 8 creates a threat to life, public health, welfare, or 9 safety by reason of major natural disaster, epidemic, riot, fire, or similar events and to a lesser extent, 10 11 by reason of equipment failures, repairs to public property in order to protect against further loss of, 12 13 or damage to, public property, or to prevent or 14 minimize serious disruption in continued functioning 15 of government services, or such other reason as may be 16 determined by the head of that purchasing agency;

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1 (2) The emergency condition generates an immediate and 2 serious need for goods, services, or construction that 3 cannot be met through normal procurement methods and 4 the government would be seriously injured if the 5 purchasing agency is not permitted to employ the means 6 it proposes to use to obtain the goods, services or 7 construction; and

8 Without the needed good, service, or construction, the (3) 9 continued functioning of government, the preservation 10 or protection of irreplaceable property, or the health 11 and safety of any person will be seriously threatened. 12 (b) The emergency procurement shall be made with such 13 competition as is practicable under the circumstances [and, 14 where practicable, approval from the chief procurement officer 15 shall be obtained prior to the procurement]. A written 16 determination of the basis for the emergency and for the 17 selection of the particular contractor shall be included in the 18 contract file.

19 (c) The head of the purchasing agency that makes an
 20 emergency procurement in response to a serious threat to life,
 21 public health, welfare, or safety by reason of major natural



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1	disaster, epidemic, riot, fire, or similar events and to a
2	lesser extent, equipment failures, repairs to public property in
3	order to protect against further loss of, or damage to, public
4	property, to prevent or minimize serious disruption in continued
5	functioning of government services, shall account for the money
6	spent in making the procurement and report on that accounting to
7	the chief procurement officer in a timely manner and to the
8	legislature within sixty days after the end of the fiscal year
9	in which the procurement was made."
10	SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
11	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
12	SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.



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Report Title:

Emergency; Procurement; Public Property; Repairs; Equipment Failures; Government Services

Description:

Allows the head of a purchasing agency to obtain emergency procurements due to equipment failures; repairs to public property to protect against further loss of, or damage to, public property; and to prevent or minimize serious disruption in continued functioning of government services. Replaces Chief Procurement Officer approval with an accounting report to the Chief Procurement Officer in a timely manner and to the Legislature within sixty days after the end of the fiscal year in which the procurement was made.
