A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO COMMERCIAL DRIVER'S LICENSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The purpose of this Act is to amend section
- 2 286-236, Hawaii Revised Statutes, to comply with federal
- 3 regulations in title 49 Code of Federal Regulations part 380,
- 4 subpart F.
- 5 Effective February 7, 2022, the Federal Motor Carrier
- 6 Safety Administration is requiring states to comply with federal
- 7 regulations requiring entry level driver training for certain
- 8 first-time commercial driver license applicants. This Act
- 9 modifies the statutes to comply with the requirement. Failure
- 10 to comply will result in a penalty. The first year the State
- 11 fails to comply will result in the withholding of four per cent
- 12 of funds required to be apportioned to Hawaii under title 23
- 13 United States Code section 104(b)(1) and (2). The second and
- 14 subsequent years the State is out of compliance result in an
- 15 eight per cent penalty. The dollar amounts that will be
- 16 withheld respectively are \$6,185,220 and \$12,370,440.

1	SECTION 2. Section 286-236, nawall Revised Statutes, is
2	amended as follows:
3	1. By amending subsection (e) to read:
4	"(e) The commercial learner's permit shall not be valid
5	for a period in excess of one hundred eighty days $[-]$:
6	(1) From the date that the applicant passes the general
7	and all required endorsement knowledge tests; or
8	(2) If the applicant is not required to take a knowledge
9	test, from the date that the permit is issued.
10	When driving a commercial motor vehicle, the holder of a
11	commercial learner's permit shall be accompanied by a person
12	with a valid commercial driver's license to operate that
13	category of commercial motor vehicle with the proper
14	endorsements. The licensed person shall occupy the seat beside
15	the individual for the purpose of giving instruction in driving
16	the commercial motor vehicle. The commercial learner's permit
17	may be renewed no more than an additional one hundred eighty
18	days without requiring the commercial learner's permit holder to
19	retake the general or endorsement knowledge tests, and the
20	applicant requalifies meeting the requirements of subsection
21	(d). The commercial learner's permit holder is eligible to take

- 1 the commercial driver's license skills test no earlier than
- 2 fourteen days after obtaining the permit."
- 3 2. By amending subsection (g) to read:
- 4 "(g) Every applicant shall successfully complete the
- 5 commercial driver's license general knowledge test before being
- 6 issued a commercial learner's permit. A driver holding a valid
- 7 commercial driver's license who seeks an upgrade for which a
- 8 skills test is required shall also pass the appropriate
- 9 knowledge test prior to obtaining a commercial learner's permit.
- 10 As of February 7, 2022, except for a driver holding a valid
- 11 commercial learner's permit or commercial driver's license that
- 12 was obtained prior to February 7, 2022, every applicant shall
- 13 complete the entry-level driver training requirements as
- 14 specified in title 49 Code of Federal Regulations part 380,
- 15 subpart F, and be verified with the Federal Motor Carrier Safety
- 16 Administration Training Provider Registry prior to taking the
- 17 skills test for class A or class B commercial driver's license,
- 18 passenger endorsement, or school bus endorsement, and prior to
- 19 taking the knowledge test for a hazardous materials
- 20 endorsement."

- 1 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 2 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 3 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2050.

Transportation; Commercial Driver's License

Description:

Adds a requirement for certain commercial driver's license applicants to complete an entry-level driver training course before taking a skills test for licensure. Exempts applicants who hold a valid commercial learner's permit or commercial driver's license obtained prior to February 7, 2022. Effective 1/1/2050. (SD1)
