A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE PHASEOUT OF PRIVATE CORRECTIONAL FACILITIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	ION 1. Chapter 353, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended b	y adding a new section to part I to be appropriately
3	designate	d and to read as follows:
4	" <u>§</u> 35	3- Construction and expansion of correctional
5	facilitie	s; input and recommendations of Hawaii correctional
6	system ov	ersight commission required. (a) No new correctional
7	facility	shall be constructed and no existing correctional
8	facility	shall be expanded unless:
9	(1)	The department first obtains input on and
10		recommendations from the Hawaii correctional system
11		oversight commission on any master plan for the
12		facility; and
13	(2)	The input and recommendations from the Hawaii
14		correctional system oversight commission are included
15		in any environmental impact statement on the project.
16	(b)	To facilitate the input and recommendations of the
17	Hawaii co	rrectional system oversight commission as provided in

1	subsection (a), the department shall submit the following		
2	information to the Hawaii correctional system oversight		
3	commissio	n upon the commission's request:	
4	(1)	The proposed maximum inmate population of the	
5		<pre>facility;</pre>	
6	(2)	Any programs proposed for the facility, including	
7		reentry programs, facility educational and treatment	
8		programs, rehabilitative services, work furloughs, and	
9		parole services; and	
10	(3)	Any other relevant information required by the	
11		commission as established by rules adopted pursuant to	
12		<pre>chapter 91."</pre>	
13	SECT	ION 2. Section 353L-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is	
14	amended b	y amending subsection (b) to read as follows:	
15	"(b)	The commission shall:	
16	(1)	Oversee the State's correctional system and have	
17		jurisdiction over investigating complaints at	
18		correctional facilities and facilitating a	
19		correctional system transition to a rehabilitative and	
20		therapeutic model;	

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1	(2)	Establish maximum inmate population limits for each
2		correctional facility and formulate policies and
3	er er	procedures to prevent the inmate population from
4		exceeding the capacity of each correctional facility;
5	(3)	Consult with the department of public safety on the
6		planning of any new or expanded correctional facility
7		in the State, and provide input and recommendations on
8		any master plan for the facility, for inclusion in any
9		environmental impact statement on the project, as
10		provided in section 353- ;
11	[(3)]	(4) Work with the department of public safety in
12		monitoring and reviewing the comprehensive offender
13		reentry program, including facility educational and
14		treatment programs, rehabilitative services, work
15		furloughs, and the Hawaii paroling authority's
16		oversight of parolees. The commission may make
17		recommendations to the department of public safety,
18		the Hawaii paroling authority, and the legislature
19		regarding reentry and parole services; [and]
20	[(4)]	(5) Ensure that the comprehensive offender reentry
21		system under chapter 353H is working properly to

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1		provide programs and services that result in the
2		timely release of inmates on parole when the maximum
3		terms have been served instead of delaying the release
4		for lack of programs and services[+]; and
5	<u>(6)</u>	Create a comprehensive plan to phase out private
6		correctional institutions by . The commission
7		shall seek input from the department of the attorney
8		general, office of the prosecuting attorney, office of
9		the public defender, judiciary, and department of
10		public safety in creating the plan. A report
11		transmitting the plan, including any proposed
12		legislation, shall be submitted to the legislature no
13		later than twenty days prior to the convening of the
14		regular session of . For the purposes of this
15		subsection, "private correctional institution"
16		includes any facility:
17		(A) Owned by the State and operated by a non-
18		governmental entity; or
19		(B) Operated under a public-private partnership.

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- 1 To achieve these ends, the commission shall authorize the
- 2 oversight coordinator to adopt rules in accordance with
- 3 chapter 91."
- 4 SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 5 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 6 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 3050.

Requires the Hawaii correctional oversight commission to create a comprehensive plan to phase out the use of private correctional institutions. Prohibits the construction of new correctional facilities and the expansion of existing correctional facilities without first obtaining input and recommendations of the Hawaii correctional system oversight commission. Effective 7/1/3050. (HD1)
