A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CATALYTIC CONVERTERS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECT	TON 1. Chapter 289, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended b	y adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to re	ad as follows:
4	" <u>§</u> 28	9- Statement required; catalytic converter. (a)
5	Every lic	ensee, when the licensee purchases a catalytic
6	converter	within the State, shall obtain a written statement
7	signed by	the seller certifying that the seller has the lawful
8	right to	sell and dispose of the catalytic converter. This
9	statement	shall also contain the:
10	(1)	Seller's name, business or residence address, and
11		occupation;
12	(2)	Description, including serial numbers and other
13		identifying marks, when practical, of every catalytic
14		converter;
15	(3)	Amount paid to the seller;
16	(4)	Date, time, and place of the sale; and

1	<u>(5)</u>	License number of any vehicle used to deliver the
2		property to the place of purchase.
3	(b)	The seller shall provide a copy of a receipt that
4	describes,	with particularity:
5	(1)	The exact item that is being offered for sale;
6	(2)	Who issued the receipt;
7	(3)	The date of sale of the item prior to the item being
8		offered to the licensee; and
9	(4)	The price, if any, of the item when obtained by the
10		<pre>seller;</pre>
11	provided t	that the seller shall also provide to the licensee a
12	notarized	declaration, describing with particularly, the make,
13	model, yea	ar, color, vehicle identification number, and license
14	number of	the vehicle from which the catalytic converter was
15	removed; p	provided further that this subsection shall not apply
16	to the pur	chase of catalytic converters by manufacturing,
17	industrial	, or other commercial vendors that generate or sell
18	catalytic	converters in the ordinary course of their business,
19	such as li	censed scrap dealers, towing companies, or muffler
20	repair sho	pps.

1	(c) If a receipt is not available, the seller shall		
2	provide to the licensee a notarized declaration, describing with		
3	particularity:		
4	(1) The exact item that is being offered for sale;		
5	(2) Who sold or otherwise transferred the item to the		
6	seller;		
7	(3) The date of sale of the item; and		
8	(4) The price, if any, of the item when obtained by the		
9	seller.		
10	(d) If the seller does not provide a copy of the receipt		
11	or the notarized declaration as required by subsections (b) and		
12	(c), the licensee shall not purchase the catalytic converter, in		
13	whole or in part, and shall report the attempted sale to the		
14	police.		
15	(e) If the licensee purchases any catalytic converter, in		
16	whole or in part, the licensee shall take a photograph or		
17	photographs of the catalytic converter offered for sale.		
18	(f) The licensee shall require the seller to verify the		
19	seller's identity by presenting a valid photo identification		
20	card or license issued by a federal or state government agency		
21	authorized to issue valid identification. The licensee shall:		

1 Take a photograph of the seller; or (1) 2 (2) Make a photocopy of the identification card or license 3 of the seller. 4 The licensee shall keep at the licensee's place of 5 business the signed written statement, receipt or notarized 6 declaration required by subsections (b) and (c), photographs 7 required by subsection (e), and photocopy of the identification 8 card or license or photograph of the seller required by 9 subsection (f), if applicable, from the seller for a period of 10 two years after the date of purchase and the statement, receipt 11 or notarized declaration required by subsections (b) and (c), 12 photographs required by subsection (e), and photocopy or 13 photograph required by subsection (f), if applicable, may be 14 examined at any time by the director of finance, chief of 15 police, attorney general, prosecuting attorney, or their 16 designees. 17 (h) For purposes of this section, "catalytic converter" 18 means a device that is incorporated in a motor vehicle's exhaust 19 system and contains a catalyst for converting pollutant gas 20 emissions into less harmful emissions."

- 1 SECTION 2. Chapter 708, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended by adding a new section to part IV to be appropriately
- 3 designated and to read as follows:
- 4 "§708- Theft of catalytic converter. (1) A person
- 5 commits the offense of theft of catalytic converter if the
- 6 person obtains, receives, retains, disposes of, or exerts
- 7 unauthorized control over a catalytic converter through any
- 8 means described in section 708-830.
- 9 (2) For the purposes of this section, "catalytic
- 10 converter" means a device that is incorporated in a motor
- 11 vehicle's exhaust system and contains a catalyst for converting
- 12 pollutant gas emissions into less harmful emissions.
- 13 (3) Theft of catalytic converter is a class C felony."
- 14 SECTION 3. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 15 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 16 begun before its effective date.
- 17 SECTION 4. New statutory material is underscored.
- 18 SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

Report Title:

Catalytic Converter; Theft; Penal Code; Class C Felony; Used Motor Vehicle Parts; Statement

Description:

Requires licensed used motor vehicle part dealers to obtain a written statement by a seller of a catalytic converter that the seller has the lawful right to sell and dispose of the catalytic converter. Requires certain sellers of a catalytic converter to present a receipt or notarized declaration regarding the catalytic converter in certain circumstances. Prohibits a licensed used motor vehicle part dealer from purchasing a catalytic converter with no receipt or notarized declaration and to report the attempted sale to the police. Establishes the offense of theft of catalytic converter as a class C felony. (SD1)

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
