A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO APPROPRIATIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that data from the 2017
- 2 American Community Survey found that 11.3 per cent of native
- 3 Hawaiian families in the State were living in poverty, compared
- 4 to an overall rate of 7.4 per cent for all families. This data
- 5 demonstrates that native Hawaiians are disproportionately
- 6 affected by poverty and is consistent with other data showing a
- 7 consistent trend of higher-than-average poverty rates among the
- 8 State's native Hawaiian population.
- 9 The legislature further finds that there is an urgent need
- 10 to provide workforce training opportunities for native Hawaiians
- 11 with low or moderate incomes. This training would help to
- 12 connect participants with high-demand, well-paying jobs whose
- 13 wages can, within five years, exceed the State's self-
- 14 sufficiency income standards.
- 15 The legislature further finds that article XII, section 4,
- 16 of the state constitution provides that certain lands set aside
- 17 to the State of Hawaii shall be held by the State as a public



- 1 trust for native Hawaiians and the general public. According to
- 2 the section 5(f) of the Admission Act, the proceeds from the
- 3 disposition of these lands shall be used for, among other
- 4 purposes, the betterment of the conditions of native Hawaiians.
- 5 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to transfer a
- 6 portion of receipts from the public land trust to the office of
- 7 community services to provide grants to certain organizations
- 8 that provide workforce training and related services to native
- 9 Hawaiians.
- 10 SECTION 2. Chapter 371K, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 11 amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
- 12 and to read as follows:
- 13 "S371K- Workforce development grants for native
- 14 Hawaiian-serving organizations. (a) The office of community
- 15 services shall establish a workforce development grant program
- 16 that shall award grants to certain organizations that provide
- 17 workforce development services to native Hawaiians. Grants
- 18 shall be funded using moneys set aside for the program pursuant
- 19 to section 10-13.3(b).

1	(b)	The office of community services, by rules adopted
2	pursuant	to chapter 91, shall develop and implement a process to
3	facilitat	e the award of grants pursuant to this section.
4	<u>(c)</u>	To receive a grant pursuant to this section, a grantee
5	shall:	·
6	(1)	Be a community service organization serving native
7		Hawaiians and whose activities principally benefit
8		native Hawaiians;
9	(2)	Focus on workforce development as its priority or as a
10		primary program or service. For the purpose of this
11		paragraph, workforce development includes programs
12		that provide training for:
13		(A) Hard-to-fill and in-demand jobs within the State;
14		and
15		(B) Emerging industries and high technology jobs
16		within the State;
17	<u>(3)</u>	Provide job placement services, job retention
18		services, and opportunities for follow-up or
19		continuing training;
20	(4)	Have established relationships or partnerships with
21		relevant industries; and

1	(5)	Provide financial literacy services and associated
2		follow-up services.
3	<u>(d)</u>	The office of community services shall award grants
4	pursuant	to this section each fiscal year; provided that:
5	(1)	The total value of grants awarded each fiscal year
6		shall not exceed \$; and
7	(2)	The office may establish a process for a grantee to
8		request the renewal of a previously awarded grant.
9	<u>(e)</u>	The office of community services shall submit a report
10	to the le	gislature no later than twenty days prior to the
11	convening	of each regular session that includes:
12	(1)	The amount of money received by the office pursuant to
13		section 10-13.3(b);
14	(2)	The total number of grants awarded;
15	(3)	A summary of each grant awarded, including the amount
16		of the grant, a description of services funded by the
17		grant, and the number of native Hawaiians who
18		benefitted from the grant; and
19	(4)	The office's findings and recommendations, including
20		any proposed legislation.

1 (f) For the purpose of this section, "native Hawaiian" has 2 the same meaning as defined in section 201 of the Hawaiian Homes 3 Commission Act, 1920." 4 SECTION 3. Section 10-13.3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 5 amended to read as follows: 6 "[f] \$10-13.3[f] Interim revenue. (a) Notwithstanding the 7 definition of revenue contained in this chapter and the provisions of section 10-13.5, and notwithstanding any claimed 8 9 invalidity of Act 304, Session Laws of Hawaii 1990, the income 10 and proceeds from the pro rata portion of the public land trust under article XII, section 6 of the state constitution for 11 12 expenditure by the office of Hawaiian affairs for the betterment of the conditions of native Hawaiians for each of fiscal year 13 14 1997-1998 and fiscal year 1998-1999 shall be \$15,100,000. 15 (b) Any income from the revenues of the public land trust 16 set aside in each fiscal year for transfer to the office of 17 Hawaiian affairs pursuant to subsection (a) that is in excess 18 \$15,100,000 may be appropriated and transferred to the office of 19 community services to provide workforce grants for the

betterment of the conditions of native Hawaiians, pursuant to

2	revenues	of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
3	much ther	eof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2021-2022 and
4	the same	sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
5	year 2022	-2023 to carry about the purposes of sections 10-
6	13.3(b) a	nd 371K- , Hawaii Revised Statutes.
7	The	sums appropriated shall be expended by the office of
8	community	services for the purposes of this Act.
9	SECT	ION 5. Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, the
10	moneys ap	propriated by and expended pursuant to this Act shall
11	be:	
12	(1)	In addition to any moneys appropriated and transmitted
13		to the office of Hawaiian affairs pursuant to section
14		10-13.3, Hawaii Revised Statutes; and
15	(2)	Credited in favor of the State toward any future
16		settlement that may be executed between the State and
17		the office of Hawaiian affairs to retire any past
18		revenue due and owing to the office of Hawaiian
19		affairs from the State pursuant to the State's
20		obligation under the Admission Act, article XII of the
21		state constitution, and chapter 10. Hawaii Revised

3	SECTION 6. Nothing in this Act shall resolve or settle, or
4	be deemed to acknowledge the existence of, the claims of native

Report Title:

Native Hawaiians; DLIR; Office of Community Services; Workforce Development; Grants; Appropriation

Description:

Establishes a workforce development grant program within the office of community services of the department of labor and industrial relations, which shall award workforce development grants to organizations that provide workforce development services to native Hawaiians. Funds the grant program using revenues from the public land trust. Makes an appropriation.

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
