#### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HISTORIC PRESERVATION.

#### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. Section 6E-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended by adding a new definition to be appropriately inserted
- 3 and to read as follows:
- 4 ""Pre-contact historic property" means any building,
- 5 structure, object, district, area, or site, including but not
- 6 limited to heiau, unu, ahu, koʻa fishing shrine, loko iʻa fishpond,
- 7 agricultural complex, habitation complex, salt pond complex, and
- 8 holua slide, that existed prior to 1779."
- 9 SECTION 2. Section 6E-3, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 10 amended to read as follows:
- 11 "S6E-3 Historic preservation program. There is
- 12 established within the department a division to administer a
- 13 comprehensive historic preservation program, which shall include
- 14 but not be limited to the following:
- 15 (1) Development of an ongoing program of historical,
- 16 architectural, and archaeological research and
- 17 development, including surveys, excavations,



1		scientific recording, interpretation, signage, and
2		publications on the State's historical and cultural
3		resources;
4	(2)	Acquisition of historic or cultural properties, real
5		or personal, in fee or in any lesser interest, by
6		gift, purchase, condemnation, devise, bequest, land
7		exchange, or other means; preservation, restoration,
8		administration, or transference of the property; and
9		the charging of reasonable admissions to that
10		property;
11	(3)	Development of a statewide survey and inventory to
12		identify and document historic properties, aviation
13		artifacts, and burial sites, including all those owned
14		by the State and the counties;
15	(4)	Preparation of information for the Hawaii register of
16		historic places and listing on the national register
17		of historic places;
18	(5)	Preparation, review, and revisions of a state historic
19		preservation plan, including budget requirements and
20		land use recommendations;

1	(6)	Application for and receipt of gifts, grants,
2		technical assistance, and other funding from public
3		and private sources for the purposes of this chapter;
4	(7)	Provision of technical and financial assistance and
5		consultation to the counties and public and private
6		agencies involved in historic preservation activities;
7	(8)	Development, publication, and distribution to the
8		public of informational materials regarding statutory
9		protections for burials, historic sites, and
10		archaeological resources, including the process of
11		project reviews established by this chapter;
12	[ <del>(8)</del> ]	(9) Coordination of activities of the counties in
13		accordance with the state plan for historic
14		preservation;
15	[ <del>(9)</del> ]	(10) Stimulation of public interest in historic
16		preservation, including the development and
17		implementation of interpretive programs for historic
18		properties listed on or eligible for the Hawaii
19		register of historic places;
20	[ <del>(10)</del> ]	(11) Coordination of the evaluation and management of
21		burial sites as provided in section 6E-43;



1	[ <del>(11)</del> ]	(12) Acquisition of burial sites in fee or in any
2		lesser interest, by gift, purchase, condemnation,
3		devise, bequest, land exchange, or other means, to be
4		held in trust;
5	[ <del>(12)</del> ]	(13) Submittal of an annual report to the governor
6		and legislature detailing the accomplishments of the
7		year, recommendations for changes in the state plan or
8		future programs relating to historic preservation, and
9		an accounting of all income, expenditures, and the
10		fund balance of the Hawaii historic preservation
11		special fund;
12	[ <del>(13)</del> ]	(14) Regulation of archaeological activities
13		throughout the State;
14	[ <del>(14)</del> ]	(15) Employment of sufficient professional and
15		technical staff for the purposes of this chapter which
16		shall be in accordance with chapter 76;
17	[ <del>(15)</del> ]	(16) The charging of fees to be determined by the
18		department that are proportional to the nature and
19		complexity of the projects or services provided, and
20		adjusted from time to time to ensure that the
21		proceeds, together with all other fines, income, and

1	penalties collected under this chapter, do not surpass
2	the annual operating costs of the comprehensive
3	historic preservation program;
4	$[\frac{(16)}{(17)}]$ Adoption of rules in accordance with chapter 91,
5	necessary to carry out the purposes of this chapter;
6	and
7	$[\frac{(17)}{(18)}]$ Development and adoption, in consultation with
8	the office of Hawaiian affairs native historic
9	preservation council, of rules governing permits for
10	access by native Hawaiians and Hawaiians to cultural,
11	historic, and pre-contact sites and monuments."
12	SECTION 3. Section 6E-5.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
13	amended by amending subsections (a) and (b) to read as follows:
14	"(a) There is created a review board, to be designated the
15	Hawaii historic places review board, for the Hawaii register of
16	historic places and the national register of historic places
17	which shall meet the requirements of federal law. The board
18	shall be placed within the department of land and natural
19	resources for administrative purposes and shall consist of ten
20	members to be appointed and removed by the governor as provided
21	in section 26-34. The board shall include one professionally

5	(b)	The review board shall:
6	(1)	Order and enter historic properties into the Hawaii
7		register of historic places on the basis of their
8		value to Hawaii's heritage[+], including but not
9		limited to native Hawaiian culture and history;
10	(2)	Evaluate and, when appropriate, recommend the
11		nomination of historic properties to the national

4	SECTION 4. Section 6E-11, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
5	amended by amending subsection (f) to read as follows:
6	"(f) Any person who violates this section shall be fined
7	not more than $[\$10,000]$ $\$20,000$ for each separate violation. If
8	the violator directly or indirectly causes the loss of, or
9	damage to, any pre-contact historic property as determined by
10	the department in consultation with the office of Hawaiian
11	affairs, the violator shall be fined no more than \$30,000 for
12	each separate violation. If the violator directly or indirectly
13	has caused the loss of, or damage to, any historic property or
14	burial site, the violator shall be fined an additional amount
15	determined by the environmental court or an administrative
16	adjudicative authority to be equivalent to the value of the lost
17	or damaged historic property or burial site. Each day of
18	continued violation of this provision shall constitute a
19	distinct and separate violation for which the violator may be
20	punished. Any landowner or developer responsible for any
21	project where violations are found to have occurred shall

- 1 execute any mitigation and preservation measures ordered by the
- 2 department and shall be jointly and severally liable for any
- 3 costs of mitigation and preservation. Equipment used by a
- 4 violator for the taking, appropriation, excavation, injury,
- 5 destruction, or alteration of any historic property or burial
- 6 site, or for the transportation of the violator to or from the
- 7 historic property or burial site, shall be subject to seizure
- 8 and disposition by the State without compensation to its owner
- 9 or owners."
- 10 SECTION 5. Section 6E-11.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 11 amended to read as follows:
- 12 "S6E-11.5 Civil penalties. Except as provided in section
- 13 6E-11, any person who violates this chapter, or any rule adopted
- 14 pursuant to this chapter shall be fined not less than \$500 nor
- 15 more than [\$10,000] \$20,000 for each separate violation. If the
- 16 violator directly or indirectly causes the loss of, or damage
- 17 to, any pre-contact historic property as determined by the
- 18 department in consultation with the office of Hawaiian affairs,
- 19 the violator shall be fined no more than \$30,000 for each
- 20 separate violation. Each day of each violation constitutes a
- 21 separate violation."

1	SECTION 6. Section 6L-12, nawall kevised Statutes, is
2	amended by amending subsection (d) to read as follows:
3	"(d) Any person violating this section shall be fined no
4	more than $[\$10,000.]$ $\$25,000.$ Each <u>historic</u> object or part of a
5	prehistoric or historic human skeleton or associated burial good
6	offered for sale or trade or removed from the jurisdiction in
7	violation of this section shall constitute a distinct and
8	separate offense for which the offender may be punished."
9	SECTION 7. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
10	matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
11	begun before its effective date.
12	SECTION 8. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
13	and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
14	SECTION 9. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.

#### Report Title:

Historic Preservation Program; Pre-contact Historic Property; Duties; Hawaii Historic Places Review Board; Penalties

#### Description:

Defines "pre-contact historic property". Clarifies that the historic preservation program includes providing consultation to counties and public and private agencies involved in historic preservation and the development, publication, and distribution of materials about protections for burials, historic sites, and archaeological resources. Amends the composition and duties of the Hawaii historic places review board. Increases civil and administrative fines for certain violations of historic and preservation requirements and makes violators liable for costs associated with mitigation or restoration measures.
