A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FARMER EQUITY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature recognizes the importance of
2 investing in the long-term prosperity of the State's food and
3 farming system, starting with its farmers. The legislature
4 finds that historical and ongoing dispossession and
5 deterritorialization has greatly impacted Native Hawaiian access
6 to land and other resources such that structural barriers to
7 farming continue to exist for Native Hawaiians. In addition,
8 immigrant farmers and farmers of color have historically not had
9 equitable access to land and other resources necessary to
10 conduct farming in Hawaii, and the legacy of disadvantage
11 persists.

12 According to the United States Department of Agriculture
13 National Agricultural Statistics Service, 2017 Census of
14 Agriculture, female farmers represent thirty-four per cent of
15 all framers referenced as primary producers in the State, while
16 only twenty-five per cent of Hawaii farmers referenced as
17 principal producers are women of color.



1 The legislature also finds that existing federal
2 agricultural policies have failed to provide sufficient and
3 appropriate technical assistance and financial support,
4 including farmer cooperative creation, for socially
5 disadvantaged farmers and ranchers.

6 Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to support socially
7 disadvantaged farmers and ranchers and include this support in
8 the department of agriculture's vision and relevant policies.

9 SECTION 2. Chapter 141, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
10 amended by adding a new section to read as follows:

11 "§141- Farmer equity. (a) As used in this section:

12 "Chairperson" means the chairperson of the board of
13 agriculture.

14 "Department" means the department of agriculture.

15 "Socially disadvantaged farmer or rancher" means a farmer
16 or rancher who is a member of a socially disadvantaged groups.

17 "Socially disadvantaged group" means a group whose members
18 have been subject to prejudice based on their race, ethnicity,
19 gender, or immigrant status because of their identity as members
20 of a group without regard to their individual qualities. These
21 groups include all of the following:



(1) Native Hawaiians;

(2) Pacific Islanders;

(3) African Americans, Africans, and Afro-Latinos;

(4) Native Americans;

(5) Alaskan Natives;

(6) Latino/a/Latinx;

(7) Asian Americans;

(8) Women; and

(9) Immigrant communities.

"Urbanized area," as used by the United States Census Bureau, refers to an area with a population of at least fifty thousand people.

(b) The department shall:

(1) Ensure the inclusion of socially disadvantaged farmers and ranchers, including socially disadvantaged farmers and ranchers in urbanized areas, in the development, adoption, implementation, and enforcement of food and agriculture laws, rules, policies, and programs;

(2) Consult with federal, state, and county agencies and departments and all other interested members of the public and private sectors in the State on



1 opportunities for socially disadvantaged farmers and
2 ranchers and to coordinate state programs;

3 (3) Disseminate information regarding opportunities
4 provided by, including but not limited to the United
5 States Department of Agriculture, United States
6 Environmental Protection Agency, United States General
7 Accounting Office, Office of Management and Budget,
8 and other federal agencies for socially disadvantaged
9 farmers and ranchers;

10 (4) Evaluate boards, committees, commissions, and advisory
11 panels related to farming and ranching in the State
12 for opportunities for inclusion of socially
13 disadvantaged farmers and ranchers; and

14 (5) Compile and report data on who receives subsidies and
15 state land leases, and whether these resources are
16 being allocated to socially disadvantaged farmers.

17 (c) The chairperson of the board of agriculture shall
18 submit a report of its findings and recommendations, including
19 any proposed legislation, on efforts to serve socially
20 disadvantaged farmers and ranchers and all female farmers and
21 ranchers in the State to the legislature no later than twenty



1 days prior to the convening of the regular session of 2022, and
2 each regular session thereafter. The report shall also provide
3 information on how to improve processes to include socially
4 disadvantaged farmers and ranchers."

5 SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.

6 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
