A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO DUAL USE TECHNOLOGY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that dual use technology
- 2 companies in Hawaii are vital to economic growth and a
- 3 diversified economy. Dual use refers to technologies that can
- 4 be used for peaceful and military aims. The legislature further
- 5 finds that Hawaii businesses are in an exceptional position to
- 6 take advantage of the strong presence of the military in the
- 7 State and the research conducted on its behalf. However, the
- 8 legislature additionally finds that the State's focus on tourism
- 9 has taken away from potentially innovative concepts, new
- 10 approaches to technology, and the leveraging of existing
- 11 facilities and military funding. Technologies developed for
- 12 military use have been appropriated by businesses in the past
- 13 with extraordinary success, and such technologies have the
- 14 potential to significantly contribute to Hawaii's economic
- 15 recovery and subsequently decrease its reliance on tourism.
- Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to establish a task
- 17 force to explore how dual use technology can be used to promote
- 18 the State's economic recovery and diversify its economy.



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1	SECTION 2. (a) There is established the dual use		
2	technolog	y task force within the department of business,	
3	economic	development, and tourism for administrative purposes.	
4	The dual	use technology task force shall:	
5	(1)	Explore potential dual use technology research and	
6		development projects for technology companies;	
7	(2)	Establish high-growth new venture company	
8		infrastructure development for dual use technology	
9		companies; and	
10	(3)	Create ideas for high-income job opportunities for	
11		Hawaii's residents and graduates of Hawaii's	
12		educational institutions.	
13	(b)	The dual use technology task force shall consist of	
14	the following members:		
15	(1)	One representative from the department of business,	
16		economic development, and tourism, designated by the	
17		department's director;	
18	(2)	One representative from the University of Hawaii;	
19	(3)	One representative from the Economic Development	
20		Alliance of Hawaii, Inc., who shall be jointly	
21		selected and invited to participate by the speaker of	

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1		the house of representatives and president of the
2		senate;
3	(4)	One representative from the Hawaii technology
4		development corporation;
5	(5)	One representative from the department of labor's
6		workforce development task force; and
7	(6)	One representative from the Chamber of Commerce
8		Hawaii, who shall be jointly selected and invited to
9		participate by the speaker of the house of
10		representatives and president of the senate.
11	The	speaker of the house of representatives and president
12	of the se	nate may recommend additional members with appropriate
13	specializ	ed expertise to be invited to participate on the dual
14	use techn	ology task force.
15	(c)	Members of the dual use technology task force shall
16	serve wit	hout compensation but shall be reimbursed for
17	reasonabl	e expenses, including travel expenses, necessary for
18	the perfo	rmance of their duties.
19	(d)	The dual use technology task force shall:
20	(1)	Submit a preliminary report of its findings and
21		recommendations, including any proposed legislation,

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1		to the legislature no later than twenty days prior to
2		the convening of the regular session of 2023; provided
3		that the preliminary report shall discuss the
4		objectives and issues listed in subsection (a); and
5	(2)	Submit a final report of its findings and
6		recommendations, including any proposed legislation,
7		to the legislature no later than twenty days prior to
8		the convening of the regular session of 2025.
9	(e)	The department of business, economic development, and
10	tourism s	hall provide administrative and clerical support as
11	required	by the dual use technology task force.
12	(f)	For the purposes of this section, "dual use
13	technolog	y" means technology that has military and civilian
14	applicati	ons; provided that "dual use technology" may be amended
15	and refin	ed by the task force over time as part of its findings

19 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2021.

(g) The dual use technology task force shall be dissolved

and recommendations.

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Report Title:

Dual Use Technology; Economic Recovery; DBEDT; UH; Task Force

Description:

Creates a dual use technology task force within the department of business, economic development, and tourism to explore how dual use technology can be used to promote economic recovery and diversify the State's economy. Requires the task force to submit reports to the legislature prior to the regular sessions of 2023 and 2025. (CD1)

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
