RELATING TO THE DEPARTMENT OF ACCOUNTING AND GENERAL SERVICES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Section 40-5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended to read as follows:
3	"§40-5 Annual reports. (a) The comptroller shall make an
4	annual report to the governor and to the legislature. Beginning
5	July 1, 2022, the comptroller shall include in the comptroller's
6	annual report a list of all accounts closed by the comptroller
7	during the immediately preceding fiscal year and a list of any
8	accounts that remain open but are serving a lapsed program or
9	initiative.
10	(b) The comptroller [may], in the comptroller's yearly
11	report, or in any special report [which] that the comptroller
12	[may at any time think] thinks fit to make, may recommend any
13	[plans] <u>:</u>
14	(1) Plans and suggestions that the comptroller [may think]
15	thinks fit or worthy of adoption for the better
16	collection, custody, and payment of the public moneys
17	and the more economical auditing and examining of the

public accounts[7]; and [any improvements]

(2) Improvements in the mode of keeping these accounts 1 2 that may at any time be brought to the comptroller's 3 notice, 4 and generally report upon all matters relating to public 5 accounts." SECTION 2. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 6 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored. 7 8 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
