RELATING TO PUBLIC LIBRARIES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 312, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated
3	and to read as follows:
4	"§312- Pilot program for lease of public library land.
5	(a) There shall be established a pilot program for the lease of
6	public library land, including facilities. The state librarian,
7	in consultation with the board of education and any other
8	appropriate agency, shall serve as the facilitator of the pilot
9	program.
10	(b) Notwithstanding section 171-13, or any other law to
11	the contrary, the board of education may lease public library
12	land on terms it deems appropriate, including a leaseback of all
13	or a portion of the improvements constructed; provided that:
14	(1) The board of education may identify and select up to
15	five public library land sites as candidates for
16	participation in the pilot program; provided further
17	that:



1		(A)	During the identification and selection process,
2			the board of education shall be subject to
3			chapter 92, shall hold at least one public
4			meeting in each affected community, and shall
5			promote library and community participation; and
6		<u>(B)</u>	If the site is on land owned by the county, the
7			department of education shall consult with the
8			county;
9	(2)	The	board of education may lease no more than three
10		publ	ic library land sites identified and selected by
11		the	board of education pursuant to paragraph (1) under
12		leas	es for a term of not more than fifty-five years
13		per	lease, unless extended pursuant to section 171-36,
14		<u>to 1</u>	essees who shall be required to modify, construct,
15		<u>or u</u>	tilize facilities to meet the mission of the
16		publ	ic libraries, in accordance with specific request
17		for	proposal or request for information guidelines;
18	(3)	Each	a lease shall stipulate that the lessee may retain
19		any	revenue generated from the facilities; provided
20		furt	ther that:

1		(A)	The lessee shall be obligated to maintain and
2			operate the facilities to meet the mission of the
3			public libraries for the length of the lease;
4		<u>(B)</u>	The lessee shall pay all applicable property
5			taxes on the value of any improvements;
6		<u>(C)</u>	A leasehold premium may be charged to the lessee
7			for the right to use the public library land
8			based on a competitive process that complies with
9			applicable sections of chapter 103D;
10		(D)	Upon the expiration of the lease, the facilities
11			shall revert to the board of education; and
12		<u>(E)</u>	All revenues and proceeds derived by the State
13			under this section shall be deposited in the
14			library facilities fund pursuant to subsection
15			<u>(f); and</u>
16	(4)	Notw	ithstanding any law to the contrary, the board of
17		educ	ation may enter into leaseback agreements that
18		allo	w the board of education to lease or sublease the
19		prop	erty to a third party. The board of education may
20		leas	e back the property from the third-party lessee or

3	(c) Any redevelopment involving nonlibrary purposes shall:					
4	(1) Comply with county plans, ordinances, and zoning and					
5	development codes; and					
6	(2) Acquire all required government approvals and permits.					
7	(d) Nothing in this section shall preclude the state					
8	librarian or the board of education from working with and					
9	receiving assistance from any other department or agency in					
10	carrying out the purposes of this section.					
11	(e) Any lease entered into by the board of education					
12	pursuant to subsection (b) shall be fully executed no later than					
13	July 1, 2031.					
14	(f) There is established in the state treasury the library					
15	facilities fund. All proceeds from the leases, permits,					
16	interest income generated from public library lands, and other					
17	revenue generated from the nonpermanent disposition of public					
18	library lands, including facilities, pursuant to this section					
19	shall be deposited into the library facilities fund. Except as					
20	otherwise provided by law, all moneys in the library facilities					
21	fund shall be used for state library programs."
