A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO CARBON OFFSETS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that climate change is 2 the most pressing issue of our time. There are many 3 contributors to climate change, and transportation-generated 4 greenhouse gas emissions are a significant contributor. The 5 legislature acknowledges that, within the transportation sector, 6 the air transportation component faces particularly difficult 7 technical challenges in reducing carbon dioxide emissions 8 associated with air travel. Since air travel is essential to 9 tourism, the legislature finds that air travel and its 10 associated carbon emissions will remain key elements of Hawaii's 11 intertwined economy and climate for the foreseeable future.

In the past few years, the United Nations has established an extensive framework for the provision of carbon offsets for carbon emissions resulting from international air travel, known as carbon offsetting and reduction scheme for international aviation. A pilot phase for this program is scheduled for 2021. However, the carbon offsetting and reduction scheme for



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international aviation will not apply to air travel to Hawaii
from the continental United States.

The legislature further finds that, for essential activities, including air travel, that are intractably resistant, at least in the near term, to technological solutions to carbon emission reductions, the use of carbon offsets to compensate for those emissions is a strategic necessity for achieving the zero emission clean economy target set for the State by Act 15, Session Laws of Hawaii 2018.

10 The purpose of this Act is to provide a process by which 11 the department of transportation shall assist persons traveling 12 by air to or from airports in Hawaii in the purchase of 13 verifiable carbon offsets to compensate for carbon dioxide 14 emissions from air travel. While this Act relies on the 15 voluntary purchase of carbon offsets by air travelers from 16 providers of the offsets, the legislature anticipates that many 17 travelers will take advantage of the program, given the 18 increasing awareness by air travelers of the climate change implications of their travel. The legislature additionally 19 20 finds that the ease of purchasing offsets may have the effect of 21 enhancing the desirability of travel to Hawaii.

9	(1)	Shall receive requests from persons who will be	
10		engaging in, or have recently engaged in, qualified	
11		air travel to or from an airport in the State for	
12		assistance in voluntarily purchasing a verified carbon	
13		offset for the carbon dioxide emissions associated	
14		with each person's qualified air travel;	
15	(2)	Shall use reasonable best efforts to facilitate the	
16		requestor's connection with a provider of verified	
17		carbon offsets for carbon dioxide emissions from air	
18		travel from whom the requestor may purchase a carbon	
19		offset for the requestor's trip;	
20	(3)	Shall place information on the department's website	
21		describing the process being made available by the

14	(6)	May contract with other entities to conduct one or

17	(b)	For the purposes of this section:
18	<u>"Car</u>	bon offset" means a reduction in carbon dioxide or
19	other gre	enhouse gases in, or emitted into, the atmosphere that
20	<u>is achiev</u>	ed by or on behalf of a person to compensate, in a
21	<u>carbon di</u>	oxide-equivalent amount, for the emissions of carbon



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1	dioxide resulting from air travel by the person to or from an
2	airport in the State. "Carbon offset" includes an action that
3	removes greenhouse gases from the atmosphere or that reduces
4	future greenhouse gas emissions.
5	"Qualified air travel" means any air travel regulated under
6	this chapter that occurs between an airport in the State and any
7	other airport in the State or in another state or United States
8	territory.
9	"Verified" means, with respect to a carbon offset, a
10	reduction in carbon dioxide, or carbon dioxide-equivalent amount
11	of other greenhouse gases, that is determined to be real,
12	permanent, and unlikely to occur in the absence of an offset
13	program, through a process of validation and verification by an
14	independent third party."
15	SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
16	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2050.
