A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FARM ANIMALS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The purpose of this act is to improve the		
2	regulation of egg production and sales to protect the health and		
3	welfare of consumers, promote food safety, advance animal		
4	welfare, and protect against the negative fiscal effects on the		
5	State associated with the lack of effective regulation of egg		
6	production and sales.		
7	SECTION 2. The Hawaii Revised Statutes is amended by		
8	adding a new chapter to be appropriately designated and to read		
9	as follows:		
10	"CHAPTER		
11	CONFINEMENT STANDARDS FOR EGG-LAYING HENS		
12	§ -A Definitions. As used in this chapter:		
13	"Business owner or operator" means any person who owns or		
14	controls the operations of a business.		
15	"Cage-free housing system" means an indoor or outdoor

10	controlled environment for egg-laying hens within which hens are		

1	them to exhibit natural behaviors, including scratch areas,		
2	perches, nest boxes, and dust bathing areas; and within which		
3	farm employees can provide care while standing within the hens'		
4	usable floor space. "Cage-free housing system" includes:		
5	(1) Multi-tiered aviaries;		
6	(2) Partially-slatted systems; and		
7	(3) Single-level all-litter floor systems.		
8	"Cage-free housing systems" does not include systems		
9	commonly described as battery cages, colony cages, enriched		
10	cages, enriched colony cages, modified cages, convertible cages,		
11	furnished cages, or similar cage systems.		
12	"Confined in a cruel manner" means the confinement of an		
13	egg-laying hen in an enclosure other than a cage-free housing		
14	system with less than:		
15	(1) One square foot of usable floor space per hen in		
16	multi-tiered aviaries, partially-slatted systems, or		
17	any other cage-free system that provides hens with		
18	unfettered access to vertical space; or		
19	(2) One and a half square feet of usable floor space per		
20	hen in a single-level all-litter floor system, or any		

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other cage-free system that does not provide hens with 1 2 unfettered access to vertical space. "Egg-laying hen" means a female domesticated chicken, 3 turkey, duck, goose, or quinea fowl kept for the purpose of 4 5 commercial egg production. "Egg products" means eggs of an egg-laying hen broken from 6 7 the shells and intended for human food, whether in liquid, 8 solid, dried, or frozen form; whether raw or cooked; and with 9 the yolks and whites in their natural proportions, or with the yolks and whites separated, mixed, or mixed and strained. 10 The 11 term does not include combination food products, including pancake mixes, cake mixes, cookies, pizzas, cookie dough, ice 12 13 cream, or similar food products that consist of more than egg products, sugar, salt, water, seasoning, coloring, flavoring, 14 15 preservatives, stabilizers, and similar food additives. 16 "Enclosure" means a structure used to confine an egg-laying 17 hen or hens. "Farm" means the land, building, support facilities, and 18 other equipment that are wholly or partially used for the 19 commercial production of animals or animal products used for 20

21 food. The term does not include live animal markets,

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establishments, or other official plants at which mandatory 1 2 inspection is maintained under the Federal Egg Products 3 Inspection Act (21 U.S.C. section 1031, et seq.). "Farm owner or operator" means any person who owns or 4 5 controls the operations of a farm. 6 "Multi-tiered aviary" means a cage-free housing system in which hens have unfettered access to multiple elevated platforms 7 that provide hens with usable floor space both on top of and 8 9 underneath the platforms. 10 "Partially-slatted system" means a cage-free housing system in which hens have unfettered access to elevated flat platforms 11 under which manure drops through the flooring to a pit or litter 12 removal belt below the platform. 13 14 "Person" means any individual, firm, partnership, joint 15 venture, association, limited liability company, corporation, estate, trust, receiver, or syndicate. 16 "Sale" means a commercial sale by a business that sells any 17 item covered by this chapter, but does not include any sale 18 19 undertaken at an establishment at which mandatory inspection is maintained under the Federal Eqq Products Inspection Act (21 20

U.S.C. section 1031, et seq.). For purposes of this chapter, a

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"sale" shall be deemed to occur at the location where the buyer
 takes physical possession of the item.

3 "Shell egg" means a whole egg of an egg-laying hen in its4 shell form that is intended for use as human food.

5 "Single-level all-litter floor system" means a cage-free
6 housing system bedded with litter, in which hens have limited or
7 no access to elevated flat platforms.

"Usable floor space" means the total square footage of 8 floor space provided to each eqq-laying hen, as calculated by 9 10 dividing the total square footage of floor space provided to the animals in an enclosure by the number of animals in that 11 enclosure. In the case of eqq-laying hens, "usable floor space" 12 includes both ground space and elevated level or nearly level 13 14 flat platforms upon which hens can roost but does not include 15 perches or ramps.

16 § -B Prohibitions. (a) Notwithstanding any other
17 provision of law to the contrary, beginning December 31, 2025,
18 it shall be unlawful for a farm owner or operator within the
19 State to knowingly cause any egg-laying hen to be confined in a
20 cruel manner.

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1	(b)	Notwithstanding any other provision of law to the
2	contrary,	beginning December 31, 2025, it shall be unlawful for
3	a busines	${f s}$ owner or operator to knowingly engage in the sale in
4	the State	of any shell egg or egg product that the business
5	owner or	operator knows or should know was produced by an egg-
6	laying he	n that was confined in a cruel manner.
7	§	-C Exceptions. This chapter shall not apply during:
8	(1)	Medical research;
9	(2)	Examination, testing, or individual treatment or
10		operation for veterinary purposes performed by or
11		under the direct supervision of a veterinarian;
12	(3)	Transportation;
13	(4)	State or county fair exhibitions, 4-H programs, and
14		similar exhibitions;
15	(5)	Slaughter in accordance with any applicable laws,
16		rules, and regulations; or
17	(6)	Temporary periods for animal husbandry purposes for no
18		more than six hours in a twenty-four hour period and
19		no more than twenty-four hours total in a thirty-day
20		period.

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§ -D Applicability. This chapter shall not apply to a
 farm owner or operator who exclusively produces shell eggs, with
 an annual egg production from a flock of ten thousand or fewer
 egg-laying hens provided that:

The farm owner or operator does not knowingly cause 5 (1)any egg-laying hen to be confined with less than one 6 7 square foot of usable floor space per hen, unless such 8 confinement is exempt pursuant to section -C; and Any egg-laying hen added to the flock after 9 (2) December 31, 2025, that raises the farm's total flock 10 size to more than ten thousand egg-laying hens is not 11 12 confined in a cruel manner.

13 § -E Penalties. (a) Any person who violates any
14 provision of this chapter shall be subject to a fine in an
15 amount not less than \$500 and not to exceed \$1,000 per
16 violation.

(b) In addition to the penalties listed in subsection (a),
a violation of section -B(b) shall be considered an unfair
method of competition and unfair or deceptive trade practice
under chapter 481A, upon which any person may bring an action.

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S -F Defense. It shall be a defense to any action to
 enforce this chapter that a business owner or operator relied in
 good faith upon a written certification by the supplier that the
 shell egg or egg product was not derived from an egg-laying hen
 that was confined in a cruel manner.

6 S -G Rules. The department of agriculture shall adopt
7 rules, pursuant to chapter 91, necessary for the purposes of
8 this chapter.

9 S -H Construction. The provisions of this chapter shall
10 be in addition to, and not in lieu of, any other law protecting
11 animal welfare. This chapter shall not be construed to limit
12 any other state laws or rules protecting the welfare of animals
13 or to prevent the counties from adopting and enforcing
14 ordinances, laws, and rules that are more restrictive than this
15 chapter."

16 SECTION 3. If any provision of this Act, or the 17 application thereof to any person or circumstance, is held 18 invalid, the invalidity does not affect other provisions or 19 applications of the Act that can be given effect without the 20 invalid provision or application, and to this end the provisions 21 of this Act are severable.

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SECTION 4. In codifying the new sections added by 1 2 section 2 of this Act, the revisor of statutes shall substitute appropriate section numbers for the letters used in designating 3 4 the new sections in this Act.

SECTION 5. This Act shall take effect upon its approval. 5

Egg-Laying Hens; Confinement Standards; Agriculture

Description:

Requires farm owner or operators to confine egg-laying hens in accordance with the standards established in this measure. Effective 12/31/25, prohibits a business owner or operator from selling shell eggs or egg products that are produced by egg-laying hens that were confined in a cruel manner.

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
