A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO FIREARMS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1 SECTION 1. (a) The department of public safety shall
2 establish a voluntary firearm buyback center in each county in
3 the State. Each center shall adopt a "no questions asked"
4 policy and allow citizens to turn in any unwanted firearm in
5 return for compensation.

6 (b) The department shall adopt rules in accordance with
7 chapter 91 to implement this section.

8 SECTION 2. There is appropriated out of the general
9 revenues of the State of Hawaii the sum of \$ or so
10 much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal year 2021-2022 and
11 the same sum or so much thereof as may be necessary for fiscal
12 year 2022-2023 for the establishment of a firearm buyback center
13 in each county in the State.

14 The sums appropriated shall be expended by the department
15 of public safety for the purposes of this Act.



1 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2021.
