A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AGRICULTURE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. Chapter 421, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
2	amended by adding three new sections to be appropriately
3	designated and to read as follows:
4	" <u>§421-</u> Volunteers exempted. Section 421C-33 shall apply
5	to associations formed under this chapter.
6	§421- Operation as an agent on nonprofit basis. (a) A
7	cooperative may operate as an agent to sell the products of its
8	members or nonmember patrons on a nonprofit basis by contracting
9	to pay the members or nonmember patrons the resale price for
10	products sold by them to or through the cooperative, less a
11	uniform charge to cover the expenses involved in the handling of
12	these products; provided that:
13	(1) The resale price shall be the actual resale price or a
14	price based upon the average price during any period
15	for products of the same type and quantity; and
16	(2) The uniform charge for expenses shall be:

17 (A) Specified in the contract;

2	(C) Left for determination by the directors.
3	(b) A cooperative that desires to purchase goods or obtain

The articles or bylaws may provide that upon demand of two-fifths of all the directors, or by the 6 affirmative vote of two-thirds of the members voting thereon at 7 8 any regular meeting or at a special meeting called for that purpose, any matter of policy that has been approved or passed 9 10 by the board must be referred to the members for their approval before it becomes effective. [No referendum shall be allowed 11 unless it is demanded by the required number of directors-at the 12 meeting at which the matter of policy in question is adopted.] " 13 14 SECTION 6. Section 421C-36, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 15 amended to read as follows: 16 "§421C-36 Exemption of voting stock from registration. 17 Membership stock or membership certificates [under section 421C-18 3(a), or share or membership capital of any association 19 organized under or existing prior to passage of this chapter 20 shall be included as exempt securities under] issued by a 21 cooperative or patronage equity in any form and preferred stock

This Act does not affect rights and duties that 5 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were 6 begun before its effective date. 7 SECTION 8.
