A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE STATE BUILDING CODE.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the State has
- 2 traditionally allowed the individual counties to establish their
- 3 own building codes. The counties have adopted various portions
- 4 of the Uniform Building Code, but historically the code differed
- 5 from county to county. The status of fragmented building
- 6 requirements in Hawaii is of serious concern to those involved
- 7 in building ownership, design, construction, and insurance. To
- 8 remedy this problem, the State adopted Act 82, Session Laws of
- 9 Hawaii 2007, and Act 164 Session Laws of Hawaii 2014, which
- 10 sought to establish a set of statewide building codes with the
- 11 goal of applying consistent standards for building owners,
- 12 architects, contractors, and inspectors.
- 13 The legislature notes that Act 164, Session Laws of Hawaii
- 14 2014, amended part II of chapter 107, Hawaii Revised Statutes,
- 15 refines and clarifies provisions relating to the state building
- 16 code council and the adoption of Hawaii state building codes and
- 17 standards. The legislature finds that these legislative



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- 1 attempts have not obtained the desired result of a uniformed
- 2 building code throughout the State.
- 3 The purpose of this Act is to repeal the state building
- 4 code council.
- 5 SECTION 2. Chapter 107, part II, Hawaii Revised Statutes,
- 6 is repealed.
- 7 SECTION 3. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
