### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO AQUATIC RESOURCES.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Hawaii's aquatic
- 2 resources serve significant economic, ecologic, cultural, and
- 3 aesthetic importance such as to agriculture, tourism, food
- 4 production, and fisheries in the State. The legislature also
- 5 recognizes the importance of managing and conserving Hawaii's
- 6 aquatic resources and ecosystem for present and future
- 7 generations. Careful stewardship and protection of Hawaii's
- 8 aquatic resources are essential to the well-being of our island-
- 9 state.
- 10 The purpose of this Act is to strengthen the penalties for
- 11 violations of the State's aquatic resources law by:
- 12 (1) Specifying that any equipment, article, instrument,
- aircraft, vehicle, vessel, or business record used in
- 14 violation of the aquatic resources law is subject to
- forfeiture;
- 16 (2) Authorizing the imposition of a criminal fine;

1	(3)	Clarifying that the fine structure may be assessed on	
2		a per-specimen basis;	
3	(4)	Making violations of the aquatic resources law a	
4		misdemeanor, rather than a petty misdemeanor; and	
5	(5)	Permitting the department of land and natural	
6		resources to recommend community service that benefits	
7		the resource damaged when a person is ordered to	
8		perform community service in lieu of a fine.	
9	SECTION 2. Chapter 187A, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
10	amended by adding two new sections to be appropriately		
11	designated and to read as follows:		
12	" <u>§</u> 18	7A- Seizure; forfeiture of property. Any	
13	equipment	, article, instrument, aircraft, vehicle, vessel, or	
14	business record used in violation of the provisions of this		
15	chapter may be seized and shall be subject to forfeiture		
16	according	to the procedures set forth in chapter 712A.	
17	<u>§187</u>	A- Criminal fine. (a) In addition to any other	
18	civil or	administrative penalties that may be applicable under	
19	this chap	ter, any person who is convicted of violating this	
20	chapter m	ay be subject to a fine imposed under section 706-640.

2	section s	shall be deposited to the credit of the conservation and
3	resources	enforcement special fund established pursuant to
4	section 1	99-1.5."
5	SECT	TION 3. Section 187A-12.5, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
6	amended b	y amending subsections(b) and (c) to read as follows:
7	"(b)	For violations involving threatened or endangered
8	species,	the administrative fines shall be as follows:
9	(1)	For a first violation, a fine of not more than
10		\$5,000[; for each specimen;
11	(2)	For a second violation within five years of a previous
12		violation, a fine of not more than \$10,000[+] for each
13		<pre>specimen; and</pre>
14	(3)	For a third or subsequent violation within five years
15		of the last violation, a fine of not more than
16		\$15,000[-] for each specimen.
17	(c)	For all other violations the administrative fines
18	shall be	as follows:
19	(1)	For a first violation, a fine of not more than
20		\$1,000[+] for each specimen;

1 (2) For a second violation within five years of a previous 2 violation, a fine of not more than \$2,000[+] for each 3 specimen; and 4 (3) For a third or subsequent violation within five years 5 of the last violation, a fine of not more than 6 \$3,000[-] for each specimen." 7 SECTION 4. Section 187A-13, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is 8 amended as follows: 9 By amending subsection (a) to read: 10 "(a) Any person violating this chapter or any rule adopted 11 thereunder for which a penalty is not otherwise provided, shall 12 be guilty of a [petty] misdemeanor and, in addition to any other 13 penalties, shall be fined not less than: 14 (1) \$250 for a first offense; 15 (2) \$500 for a second offense; and 16 (3) \$1,000 for a third or subsequent offense." 17 2. By amending subsection (c) to read: 18 "(c) The court may direct the defendant to perform 19 community service as administered by the department in lieu of 20 paying any monetary fine authorized by this section[+]; provided

that if community service is ordered pursuant to this section,

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- 1 the department may recommend to the court community service that
- 2 benefits the resource that was damaged."
- 3 SECTION 5. This Act does not affect rights and duties that
- 4 matured, penalties that were incurred, and proceedings that were
- 5 begun before its effective date.
- 6 SECTION 6. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
- 7 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.
- 8 SECTION 7. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2021.

### Report Title:

Aquatic Resources; Violations; Penalties; Fines; Forfeiture

### Description:

Specifies that any equipment, article, instrument, aircraft, vehicle, vessel, or business record used in violation of the aquatic resources law is subject to forfeiture. Authorizes the imposition of a criminal fine. Clarifies that the fine structure may be assessed on a per-specimen basis. Makes violations of the aquatic resources law a misdemeanor, rather than a petty misdemeanor. Permits the department of land and natural resources to recommend community service that benefits the resource damaged when a person is ordered to perform community service in lieu of a fine.

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
