A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE HAWAII TOURISM AUTHORITY.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that the COVID-19
- 2 pandemic provides the State the opportunity to rethink the way
- 3 Hawaii is branded to the world and to include more Native
- 4 Hawaiian perspective in the tourism industry. The Hawaii
- 5 tourism authority's goal is to honor and perpetuate the Hawaiian
- 6 culture and community, and an additional voice for Native
- 7 Hawaiians on the Hawaii tourism authority board of directors
- 8 would help to accomplish this goal. Accordingly, the purpose of
- 9 this Act is to require at least two members on the Hawaii
- 10 tourism authority board of directors to possess knowledge,
- 11 experience, and expertise in the area of Hawaiian cultural
- 12 practices.
- 13 SECTION 2. Section 201B-2, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 14 amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows:
- 15 "(b) The authority shall be headed by a policy-making
- 16 board of directors that shall consist of twelve members;
- 17 provided that:

4	(2)	The members shall include at least one representative
5		each from the city and county of Honolulu and the
6		counties of Hawaii, Kauai, and Maui;
7	(3)	Three members shall be appointed by the governor from
8		a list of three names submitted for each appointment
9		by the president of the senate, and three members
10		shall be appointed by the governor from a list of
11		three names submitted for each appointment by the
12		speaker of the house of representatives; provided that
13		if fewer than three names are submitted for each
14		appointment, the governor may disregard the list;
15	(4)	At least six members shall have knowledge, experience,
16		and expertise in the area of accommodations,
17		transportation, retail, entertainment, or attractions,
18		and at least [one member] two members appointed by the
19		governor shall have knowledge, experience, and
20		expertise in the area of Hawaiian cultural practices;
21		provided that no more than three members shall

3	(5)	The governor shall make appointments to ensure the
4		fulfillment of all requirements of paragraphs (2) and
5		(4); provided that upon the occurrence of a vacancy
6		subject to paragraph (3), the governor shall notify
7		the president of the senate and the speaker of the
8		house of representatives of any unfulfilled
9		requirements pursuant to paragraphs (2) and (4), and
10		the president of the senate or the speaker of the
11		house of representatives, as appropriate, shall submit
12		nominees who fulfill those requirements; and
13	(6)	No person who has served as a member of the board of
14		directors of the Hawaii Visitors and Convention Bureau
15		shall be eligible to sit as a member of the board of
16		directors of the Hawaii tourism authority until at

least two years have expired between the person's

termination from service on the Hawaii Visitors and

Convention Bureau board and the person's appointment

to the authority's board of directors."

Report Title:

Hawaii Tourism Authority; Board of Directors; Members; Hawaiian Cultural Practices

Description:

Amends the composition of the Hawaii Tourism Authority Board of Directors to require at least two members, rather than one, to be appointed by the Governor who shall have knowledge, experience, and expertise in the area of Hawaiian cultural practices.
