A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO COMMERCIAL SHARK TOURS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that commercial shark
- 2 boat tours, that began in Hawaii nearly twenty years ago, are
- 3 increasingly popular with visitors and residents. Certain tours
- 4 allow customers to enter the water and view sharks from shark
- 5 cages, while other cageless tours allow customers into the water
- 6 to observe and swim near sharks.
- 7 The legislature further finds that commercial shark boat
- 8 tours are presently unregulated and, as a result, safety
- 9 measures vary greatly between operators. Sharks have the
- 10 potential to cause great harm and death to humans. Noting the
- 11 inherent risks associated with swimming with sharks and the
- 12 proliferation of shark tour operations, caged and uncaged, the
- 13 legislature finds that shark boat tours should be regulated.
- 14 The purpose of this Act is to regulate commercial shark
- 15 boat tour operators, improve public safety, and increase
- 16 protections of sharks within state waters.

1	SECTION 2. Chapter 188, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is		
2	amended by adding a new section to be appropriately designated		
3	and to read as follows:		
4	"§188- Commercial shark tour operators. (a) No		
5	commercial shark tour operator shall engage in the business of		
6	providing guided shark tours without first receiving a permit		
7	from the department of land and natural resources. The		
8	department of land and natural resources shall adopt rules to		
9	regulate commercial shark tour operations by permit that shall		
10	include but not be limited to:		
11	(1) A maximum number of commercial shark tour permits		
12	available on an annual basis;		
13	(2) Designation of permitted operating sites;		
14	(3) Training for tour guides that shall include advanced		
15	first aid and aquatic rescue;		
16	(4) Education for tour guides on shark biology and ecology		
17	administered by the University of Hawaii's Hawaii		
18	institute of marine biology or an equivalent program		
19	as determined by the department of land and natural		
20	resources;		

1	(5)	Requirements that at least one employee of the tour
2		operator shall remain on the vessel at all times;
3	(6)	Requirements that operators shall provide evidence of
4		insurance and maintain coverage that clearly
5		indemnifies the State against claims resulting from
6		the shark tour boat operations;
7	(7)	Revocation of a permit based on the failure to comply
8		with permit conditions; and
9	(8)	Annual renewal of permits.
10	(b)	For purposes of this section, "commercial shark tour
11	operator"	means any individual, firm, corporation, association,
12	partnersh	ip, or any group of persons, whether incorporated or
13	not, that	provides shark tour excursions for compensation or
14	other con	sideration."
15	SECT	ION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
16	SECT	TON 4. This Act shall take effect on January 1, 2022.
