A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that, during the
2	coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic, state and federal
3	inspectors raised numerous concerns and questions about the
4	Yukio Okutsu State Veterans Home response to the pandemic. As a
5	result, the group running the veterans' home in Hilo, Hawaii has
6	been fined nearly \$30,000. Overall, nursing homes are blamed
7	for about forty per cent of all known COVID-19 deaths in the
8	United States, which now top over 376,000. Accordingly, to help
9	prevent additional spread of infectious diseases, the purpose of
10	this Act is to:
11	(1) Require all operators of adult residential care homes,
12	assisted living facilities, long-term care facilities,
13	nursing homes, and community care facilities for the
14	elderly to establish and implement infectious disease
15	control and prevention training and other related
16	protocols;

1	(2)	Require the department of health to ensure compliance
2		with infectious disease control and prevention
3		training programs prior to the issuance or renewal of
4		a license;
5	(3)	Authorize the department of health to conduct random
6		audits to determine compliance with infectious disease
7		control and prevention training program or course
8		requirements;
9	(4)	Require the department of health to establish a
10		hotline to field calls and complaints regarding
11		violations;
12	(5)	Authorize the department of health to adopt rules,
13		including emergency rules, and assess fines;
14	(6)	Require the department of health to conduct an annual
15		announced and scheduled visit and inspection for all
16		state-licensed or state-certified care facilities, in
17		addition to its required annual inspections without
18		notice; and
19	(7)	Require applicants for nursing home administrator
20		licenses to demonstrate at least five years of

18	(2) E	stablish and implement an ongoing internal training
19	p	rogram for all staff and employees, including
20	<u>C</u>	lerical, administrative, and kitchen staff, regarding
21	t	he procedures and protocols for the control and

1		prevention of infectious diseases. The internal
2		training program shall include the protocol for
3		notifying the Hawaii emergency management agency when
4		necessary;
5	(3)	Maintain adequate staffing to include staff or
6		employees specifically responsible for re-directing
7		patients who may be unable to comply with social
8		distancing guidelines or requirements, infectious
9		disease guidelines, or other protocols;
10	(4)	Close all dining rooms, group activity rooms, common
11		areas, and public gathering areas during times of a
12		declared pandemic or outbreak of an infectious
13		disease; provided that these areas may be reopened
14		according to infectious disease protocols and
15		guidelines established by the home or facility;
16	(5)	Assign staff to designated groups or units to prevent
17		the rotation of staff that could lead to potential
18		cross-contamination, which shall apply to all kitchen,
19		maintenance, or any other positions necessary in the
20		performance of daily duties;

1	(6)	Monitor the inventory of personal protective
2		equipment, which shall include gowns, face masks,
3		gloves, and shoe covers. Shift leaders or other
4		authorized personnel shall review infectious disease
5		guidelines before each shift, continue to update
6		patient information, and document inventory of
7		personal protective equipment at each shift change;
8	(7)	Establish sanitation stations and locker rooms for
9		staff and employees to shower and change out of work
10		garments and shoes to be bagged and laundered after
11		each shift. Shoes worn during a shift shall not be
12		worn outside the home or facility; and
13	(8)	Organize and maintain data on all patients including:
14		(A) Medical conditions;
15		(B) Advance directives;
16		(C) Whether the patient can wear a face mask; and
17		(D) Whether the patient wanders due to a medication
18		or condition.
19		This data shall be made viewable to the department
20		during visits and inspections pursuant to section
21		321-1.9.

1	(b) The department shall ensure compliance with the
2	infectious disease control and prevention training program or
3	course requirements established by this section prior to the
4	issuance or renewal of any license pursuant to this chapter.
5	(c) The department may conduct random audits to determine
6	compliance with infectious disease control and prevention
7	training program or course requirements established by this
8	section. The department shall provide written notice of an
9	audit to a licensee randomly selected for audit. Within sixty
10	days of notification, the licensee shall provide the department
11	with documentation verifying compliance with the training
12	program or course requirement established by this section.
13	(d) The department shall establish a hotline to field
14	anonymous calls by staff, patients, or relatives of patients, of
15	complaints or violations of this section to prevent against
16	retaliation. The operators of adult residential care homes,
17	assisted living facilities, long-term care facilities, nursing
18	homes, and community care facilities for the elderly, shall post
19	a clear and conspicuous sign at the primary public entrance of
20	the home or facility that specifies the department's hotline
21	information.

1 (e) The department shall adopt rules pursuant to chapter 2 91 necessary to carry out the purpose of this section, including 3 the assessment of fines that may be collected for violations of 4 this section. The department shall have the authority to adopt emergency rules pursuant to section 91-3(b) if imminent peril to 5 6 the public health and safety requires adoption of a rule. 7 (f) All fines collected under this section shall be 8 deposited in the general fund of the State." 9 SECTION 3. Section 321-1.9, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is amended by amending subsection (b) to read as follows: 10 "(b) Unannounced visits may be conducted during or outside 11 12 regular business hours. All inspections relating to follow-up visits, visits to confirm correction of deficiencies, or visits 13 to investigate complaints or suspicion of abuse or neglect shall 14 be conducted unannounced during or outside regular business 15 16 hours. Annual inspections for relicensing or recertification may be conducted during regular business hours or at intervals 17 determined by the department. Annual inspections for 18 relicensing or recertification shall be conducted without 19 notice. The department shall additionally conduct an annual 20

2	licensed or state-certified care facilities."
3	SECTION 4. Section 457B-3.1, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
4	amended to read as follows:
5	"§457B-3.1 Conditions concerning qualifications for
6	licensure examination. The director shall adopt rules setting
7	minimum educational, training, and experience qualifications
8	that must be satisfied before an applicant is allowed to sit for
9	the licensing examination[-]; provided that an applicant shall
10	demonstrate a minimum of five years of experience; provided
1	further that all training, previous places of employment,
12	references, abilities to communicate with staff at all levels,
13	and certifications be documented by the applicant."

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Report Title:

Nursing Homes; Long-Term Care Facilities; Assisted Living Facilities; Department of Health; Disease Control and Prevention; Licenses; Rules; Fines

Description:

Requires operators of adult residential care homes, assisted living facilities, long-term care facilities, nursing homes, and community care facilities to establish and implement infectious disease control and prevention training and other related protocols. Requires the Department of Health to ensure compliance with infectious disease control and prevention training programs prior to the issuance or renewal of a license. Authorizes the Department of Health to conduct random audits to determine compliance with infectious disease control and prevention training program or course requirements. Requires the Department of Health to establish a hotline to field calls and complaints regarding violations. Authorizes the Department of Health to adopt rules, including emergency rules, and assess fines. Requires the Department of Health to conduct an annual announced and scheduled visit and inspection for all statelicensed or state-certified care facilities, in addition to its required annual inspections without notice. Requires applicants for nursing home administrator licenses to demonstrate at least five years of experience and the ability to document all training, experience, and certifications.

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
