A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO BOARDS AND COMMISSIONS.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

- 1 SECTION 1. The legislature finds that public members of
- 2 boards and commissions more adequately represent the public
- 3 interest when those members have no association with the
- 4 profession or any relationship with a member of the profession
- 5 that the board or commission regulates. Public members are not
- 6 expected or required to be experienced or an expert in the
- 7 regulated profession. This unique and important role of the
- 8 public member mitigates the anticompetitive effects of a board
- 9 or commission's actions, which may occur when the board or
- 10 commission is dominated by active market participants.
- 11 The legislature further finds that well-informed and
- 12 engaged public members bring several advantages to regulation,
- 13 including:
- 14 (1) Reducing the potential for board decisions that favor
- the industry over the public;

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1	(2)	Reducing the potential for decisions that
2		illegitimately favor one fraction of an industry over
3		another;
4	(3)	Encouraging public participation in government
5		decision-making;
6	(4)	Enhancing public confidence and trust in government;
7	(5)	Expanding the range of skills, talent, training, and
8		perspectives available for higher quality and creative
9		board action;
10	(6)	Raising the level of board discussions towards closer
11		scrutiny of an industry; and
12	(7)	Strengthening the board's credibility in its
13		decision-making and advocacy.
14	Acco	rdingly, the purpose of this Act is to prohibit a
15	public men	mber of any board or commission under the department of
16	commerce	and consumer affairs' purview from:
17	(1)	Being engaged in the occupation that the board or
18		commission regulates;
19	(2)	Being associated with a member of the occupation that
20		the board or commission regulates that results in a
21		material conflict of interest, an appearance of

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1		impropriety, or a reasonable suspicion that the public
2		member does not represent the public interest; or
3	(3)	Having a direct financial interest in the regulated
4		occupation.
5	SECT	ION 2. Section 26-9, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
6	amended b	y amending subsection (d) to read as follows:
7	"(d)	Except as otherwise provided by this chapter, the
8	functions	, duties, and powers, subject to the administrative
9	control o	f the director of commerce and consumer affairs, and
10	the compo	sition of each board and commission shall be as
11	provided 1	by law. A public member of any board or commission
12	listed in	subsection (c) shall not:
13	(1)	Be engaged in the occupation that the board or
14		commission regulates;
15	(2)	Be associated with a member of the occupation that the
16		board or commission regulates that results in a
17		material conflict of interest, an appearance of
18		impropriety, or a reasonable suspicion that the public
19		member does not represent the public interest; or
20	(3)	Have a direct financial interest in the occupation
21		that the board or commission regulates.

1	As used in this subsection, "material conflict of interest"
2	means a conflict of interest that has the potential to:
3	(1) Influence a member's decision or conduct; or
4	(2) Have a non-trivial impact on the financial situation
5	of a member or an entity in which the member or
6	immediate family member of the member has a
7	significant financial interest."
8	SECTION 3. New statutory material is underscored.
9	SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2112.

Description:

Prohibits a public member of any board or commission under DCCA's purview from being engaged in the occupation that the board or commission regulates; being associated with a member of the occupation that the board or commission regulates that results in a material conflict of interest, an appearance of impropriety, or a reasonable suspicion that the public member does not represent the public interest; or having a financial interest in the regulated occupation.
