### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO HEALTH CARE.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

1	PART I			
2	SECTION 1. The legislature finds that Hawaii has many			
3	qualified licensed health care providers, including physician			
4	assistants and advanced practice registered nurses, who can			
5	safely and effectively provide abortion care. However, the			
6	legislature also finds that Hawaii's current laws restrict any			
7	health care provider other than physicians from providing			
8	aspiration abortion care. Consequently, numerous Hawaii			
9	residents live on an island without, or with limited access to,			
10	an abortion care provider.			
11	The legislature further finds that the health and economic			
12	security of Hawaii's residents is suffering due to various			
13	issues caused by the State's abortion provider shortage,			
14	including unnecessary travel, long wait times, high costs, and			
15	delays to time-sensitive care. In addition, residents on Kauai,			
16	Molokai, Lanai, and the west side of the island of Hawaii do not			
17	have access to local physicians who can provide abortion care.			

- 1 These residents are therefore forced to travel long distances to
- 2 access care, increasing costs for travel, lodging, and
- 3 childcare. Travel to reach care is an insurmountable barrier
- 4 for people who already face systemic barriers to health care,
- 5 including people with low incomes, young people, survivors of
- 6 intimate partner violence, and people in rural communities. The
- 7 Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic has highlighted the
- 8 existing challenges of the abortion provider shortage and
- 9 exacerbated current barriers to care, including making travel to
- 10 access abortion care exceedingly difficult and potentially
- 11 risking viral spread of the disease.
- 12 The legislature finds that physician assistants and
- 13 advanced practice registered nurses can safely and effectively
- 14 provide aspiration abortion care. Studies have found no
- 15 difference in abortion safety when performed by qualified
- 16 licensed providers rather than physicians. Further, numerous
- 17 health care and professional organizations, including the
- 18 National Academies of Sciences, Engineering, and Medicine, agree
- 19 that restricting qualified providers from providing aspiration
- 20 abortion care confers no medical benefit and instead harms
- 21 patients by limiting access to care.

1	To improve equitable access to health care, the legislature			
2	concludes that allowing qualified licensed health care provides			
3	to provide aspiration abortion care would allow residents to			
4	stay in the residents' respective communities and safely receive			
5	high-quality care with fewer financial and logistical barriers			
6	Accordingly, the purpose of this Act is to lift the			
7	burdensome and medically unnecessary physician-only restriction			
8	on performing certain abortion care procedures to ensure that			
9	all people in Hawaii can equally access abortion care, no matter			
10	their income or where they live, by authorizing licensed			
11	physician assistants and advanced practice registered nurses to			
12	perform certain abortions.			
13	PART II			
14	SECTION 2. Chapter 453, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is			
15	amended by adding a new section to part I to be appropriately			
16	designated and to read as follows:			
17	" <u>§453-</u> Qualified health care providers; intentional			
18	termination of pregnancy. Notwithstanding any other law to the			
19	contrary, a qualified health care provider may provide			
20	aspiration abortion care; provided that the qualified health			
21	care provider:			

1	<u>(1)</u> H	Has prescriptive authority;
2	<u>(2)</u> <u>F</u>	Practices within the qualified health care provider's
3	<u>r</u>	respective scope of practice; and
4	<u>(3)</u> H	Has an unencumbered license obtained in accordance
5	<u> </u>	with this chapter or chapter 457, as applicable.
6	As use	ed in this section, "qualified health care provider"
7	means physi	cian assistants licensed under this chapter and
8	advanced pr	actice registered nurses licensed under chapter 457.
9	SECTIO	ON 3. Section 453-16, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
10	amended by	amending subsection (a) to read:
11	"(a)	No abortion shall be performed in this State unless[:

- 1 SECTION 4. Section 457-2.7, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
- 2 amended to read as follows:
- 3 "§457-2.7 Advanced practice registered nurse. (a)
- 4 Practice as an advanced practice registered nurse means the
- 5 scope of nursing in a category approved by the board, regardless
- 6 of compensation or personal profit, and includes the registered
- 7 nurse scope of practice. The scope of an advanced practice
- 8 registered nurse includes but is not limited to advanced
- 9 assessment; telehealth; and the diagnosis, prescription,
- 10 selection, and administration of therapeutic measures including
- 11 over the counter drugs, legend drugs, and controlled substances
- 12 within the advanced practice registered nurse's role and
- 13 specialty-appropriate education and certification.
- (b) An advanced practice registered nurse shall be
- 15 authorized to provide abortion care pursuant to section 453-16.
- 16 [\(\frac{\text{(b)}}{\text{]}}\) (c) The advanced practice registered nurse's scope
- 17 of practice supersedes the registered nurse's scope of practice.
- 18 Advanced practice registered nurses shall practice within
- 19 standards established or recognized by the board and be guided
- 20 by the scope of practice authorized by this chapter, the rules

- 1 of the board, and nursing standards established or recognized by 2 the board including but not limited to:
- The National Council of State Boards of Nursing Model 3 (1)4 Nursing Practice Act, Article II, Scope of Nursing 5 Practice, section 4; and
- 6 The National Council of State Boards of Nursing Model (2) 7 Nursing Administrative Rules, Chapter Two, Standards 8 of Nursing Practice, section 2.4.1;
- 9 provided that NCSBN shall have no legal authority over the board 10 and shall have no legal authority or powers of oversight of the 11 board in the exercise of its powers and duties authorized by 12 law.
- 13 [<del>(c)</del>] (d) An advanced practice registered nurse shall 14 comply with the requirements of this chapter; recognize limits 15 of the advanced practice registered nurse's knowledge and 16 experience and planning for the management of situations that 17 exceed the scope of authorized practice; and consult with or 18 refer clients to other health care providers, as appropriate." 19 SECTION 5. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed 20

and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

1 SECTION 6. This Act shall take effect upon its approval.
