### A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO THE ADVICE AND CONSENT OF THE SENATE.

### BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 26-31, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
amended to read as follows:

3 "§26-31 Selection and terms of single executives as heads of departments [-]; selection of deputy directors of departments. 4 5 (a) Except as otherwise provided by the Constitution of the State or by this chapter, each principal department shall be 6 headed by a single executive, who shall be nominated and, by and 7 8 with the advice and consent of the senate, appointed by the governor, for a term to expire at the end of the term for which 9 10 the governor was elected. A vacancy occurring during a term 11 shall be filled for the unexpired balance of the term, subject to the provisions of Article V, section 6 of the Constitution of 12 13 the State. The governor may remove a single executive from 14 office at any time, except that the removal of the attorney 15 general shall be subject to the advice and consent of the 16 senate.
