A BILL FOR AN ACT

RELATING TO LOW-INCOME HOUSING TAX CREDIT.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF HAWAII:

SECTION 1. Section 235-110.8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, is
 amended to read as follows:

3 "§235-110.8 Low-income housing tax credit. (a) As modified herein, section 42 (with respect to low-income housing 4 5 credit) of the Internal Revenue Code shall be operative for the purposes of this chapter as provided in this section. A 6 7 taxpayer owning a qualified low-income building who has been 8 awarded a subaward under section 1602 of the American Recovery 9 and Reinvestment Act of 2009, Public Law 111-5, shall also be 10 eligible for the credit provided in this section.

(b) Each taxpayer subject to the tax imposed by this chapter, who has filed a net income tax return for a taxable year may claim a low-income housing tax credit against the taxpayer's net income tax liability. The amount of the credit shall be deductible from the taxpayer's net income tax liability, if any, imposed by this chapter for the taxable year in which the credit is properly claimed on a timely basis. A



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1 credit under this section may be allocated by the partnership or 2 limited liability company in any manner agreed to by the 3 partners or members regardless of whether the individual or 4 entity to receive the credit is deemed to be a partner or member 5 for federal income tax purposes, so long as the individual or 6 entity is deemed to be a partner or member pursuant to 7 applicable state law. The credit may be claimed whether or not 8 the taxpayer [claims] is eligible to be allocated a federal lowincome housing tax credit pursuant to section 42 of the Internal 9 10 Revenue Code. 11 (c) For any qualified low-income building that receives an allocation prior to January 1, 2017, the amount of the low-12

13 income housing tax credit that may be claimed by a taxpayer as 14 provided in subsection (b) shall be fifty per cent of the 15 applicable percentage of the qualified basis of each building 16 located in Hawaii. The applicable percentage shall be 17 calculated as provided in section 42(b) of the Internal Revenue 18 Code.

19 (d) For any qualified low-income building that receives an20 allocation after December 31, 2016, the amount of the low-income

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2 provided in subsection (b) shall be: 3 For the first five years, equal to the amount of the (1) federal low-income housing tax credits that have been 4 allocated to the qualified low-income building 5 pursuant to section 42(b) of the Internal Revenue Code 6 by the corporation, provided that, if in any year the 7 8 aggregate amount of credits under this subsection 9 would be such that it would exceed the amount of state 10 credits allocated by the corporation for the qualified 11 low-income building, the credits allowed for that year 12 shall be limited to such amount necessary to bring the total of such state credits (including the current 13 14 year state credits) to the full amount of state 15 credits allocated to the qualified low-income building 16 by the corporation; For the sixth year, zero, except that, if, and only 17 (2) if, the amount of credits allowed for the first five 18 19 years is less than the full amount of state credits 20 allocated by the corporation for the qualified lowincome building, an amount necessary to bring the 21

13	Revenue Code by the corporation had a subaward not been awar	ded
14	with respect to the qualified low-income building.	
15	(f) For the purposes of this section, the determinatio	n
16	of:	
17	(1) Qualified basis and qualified low-income building	
18	shall be made under section 42(c);	
19	(2) Eligible basis shall be made under section 42(d);	
20	(3) Qualified low-income housing project shall be made	
21	under section 42(g);	



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Recapture of credit shall be made under section 42(j), 1 (4) except that the tax for the taxable year shall be 2 3 increased under section 42(j)(1) only with respect to 4 credits that were used to reduce state income taxes; 5 and 6 (5) [Application] Except as provided under subsection 7 (j)(1), application of at-risk rules shall be made 8 under section 42(k); 9 of the Internal Revenue Code. (g) As provided in section 42(e), rehabilitation 10 11 expenditures shall be treated as a separate new building and their treatment under this section shall be the same as in 12 section 42(e). The definitions and special rules relating to 13 credit period in section 42(f) and the definitions and special 14 15 rules in section 42(i) shall be operative for the purposes of this section. 16 The state housing credit ceiling under section 42(h)17 (h) shall be zero for the calendar year immediately following the 18

19 expiration of the federal low-income housing tax credit program 20 and for any calendar year thereafter, except for the carryover 21 of any credit ceiling amount for certain projects in progress



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which, at the time of the federal expiration, meet the
 requirements of section 42.

3 (i) The credit allowed under this section shall be claimed
4 against net income tax liability for the taxable year. For the
5 purpose of deducting this tax credit, net income tax liability
6 means net income tax liability reduced by all other credits
7 allowed the taxpayer under this chapter.

8 A tax credit under this section that exceeds the taxpayer's 9 income tax liability may be used as a credit against the 10 taxpayer's income tax liability in subsequent years until 11 exhausted. All claims for a tax credit under this section shall 12 be filed on or before the end of the twelfth month following the close of the taxable year for which the credit may be claimed[-] 13 14 and shall include a copy of form 8609, or any successor form 15 created by the Internal Revenue Service, and issued by the corporation with respect to the building; provided that with 16 17 respect to the first year that the credit is claimed for a 18 qualified low-income housing project, if the taxpayer has not 19 yet received the form before the time the taxpayer files the 20 original tax return claiming the credit under this section, the 21 taxpayer may claim the credit based upon the amount of credit

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1	set forth in the carryover allocation or section 42(m) letter,
2	as applicable, issued to the qualified low-income housing
3	project; and upon receipt of the form the taxpayer shall:
4	(1) Amend its tax return to include the form; and
5	(2) If the credit amount in the form is different than the
6	amount of credit previously claimed, adjust the credit
7	amount claimed on the amended return.
8	Failure to properly and timely claim the credit shall constitute
9	a waiver of the right to claim the credit. A taxpayer may claim
10	a credit under this section only if the building or project is a
11	qualified low-income housing building or a qualified low-income
12	housing project under section 42 of the Internal Revenue Code.
13	[Section] Except as provided under subsection (j)(1),
14	section 469 (with respect to passive activity losses and credits
15	limited) of the Internal Revenue Code shall be applied in
16	claiming the credit under this section.
17	(j) For any qualified low-income building placed in
18	service after December 31, 2024:
19	(1) Section 453 (with respect to the installment method),
20	section 465 (with respect to deductions limited to
21	amount at risk), and section 469 (with respect to



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1		passive activity losses and credits limited) of the
2		Internal Revenue Code shall not be operative with
3		respect to investments made in buildings and projects
4		claiming the credit under this section;
5	(2)	All allocations to partners or members of their
6		distributive shares of income, loss, and deductions
7		under this chapter shall be made in accordance with
8		the written agreement of the partners or members;
9	(3)	The total amount of state credits allocated by the
10		corporation for the qualified low-income building
11		shall not exceed fifty per cent of the total amount of
12		federal credits allocated to the building for the ten-
13		year federal credit period; and
14	(4)	The deductions and expenses claimed by all Hawaii
15		taxpayers on Hawaii income tax returns shall not
16		exceed the deductions and expenses claimed by all
17		taxpayers on federal returns;
18	provided	that this subsection shall not apply to any building
19	that ceas	es to be a qualified low-income building.
20	[(j)] (k) In lieu of the credit awarded under this section
21	for a qua	lified low-income building that has been awarded



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1 federal credits that are subject to the state housing credit 2 ceiling under section 42(h)(3)(C) of the Internal Revenue Code, 3 federal credits that are allocated pursuant to section 42(h)(4) 4 of the Internal Revenue Code, or a subaward under section 1602 5 of the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009, Public 6 Law 111-5, the taxpayer owning the qualified low-income building 7 may make a request to the corporation for a loan under section 201H-86. If the taxpayer elects to receive the loan pursuant to 8 9 section 201H-86, the taxpayer shall not be eligible for the 10 credit under this section.

11 [(k)] (1) The director of taxation may adopt any rules 12 under chapter 91 and forms necessary to carry out this section." 13 SECTION 2. Act 129, Session Laws of Hawaii 2016, is 14 amended by amending section 4 to read as follows:

15 "SECTION 4. This Act, upon its approval, shall take effect 16 on January 1, 2017, and shall apply to qualified low-income 17 buildings awarded credits after December 31, 2016; provided that 18 this Act shall be repealed on December 31, [2021,] 2027, and 19 section 235-110.8, Hawaii Revised Statutes, shall be reenacted 20 in the form in which it read on the day prior to the effective 21 date of this Act."



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SECTION 3. Statutory material to be repealed is bracketed
 and stricken. New statutory material is underscored.

3 SECTION 4. This Act shall take effect on July 1, 2050, and 4 shall apply to taxable years beginning after December 31, 2024; 5 provided that the amendments made to section 235-110.8, Hawaii 6 Revised Statutes, by section 1 of this Act shall not be repealed 7 when that section is reenacted on December 31, 2027, pursuant to 8 section 4 of Act 129, Session Laws of Hawaii 2016, as amended by 9 section 2 of this Act.

Allows the low-income housing tax credit to be allocated among the partners or members of the partnership or limited liability company earning the credit in any manner agreed to by the partners or members. Extends the increases made to the lowincome housing tax credit from 12/31/2021 to 12/31/2027. Applies to taxable years beginning after 12/31/2024. Effective 7/1/2050. (SD2)
